WATER QUALITY UPDATE REEDSVILLE UTILITY DEPARTMENT

Is the water in the Village of Reedsville Safe to drink? YES

Back in August of 2008, the Village had a water sample from Well # 5 that had a result of 10.8 mg/L. That was above the Maximum Control Limit (MCL) of 10.0 mg/L.

Upon learning of the high result, and in accordance with DNR code, the Village IMMIEDIATLEY stopped all water production from Well # 5. There has been **NO** water production from Well # 5 since that time.

All water has been produced exclusively from Well # 3, the only other source of water in the Village. The nitrate level at Well # 3 is well below the MCL. The most recent sample, at Well # 3, was 1.2 mg/L, taken on March 10, 2010.

The Village is working diligently with the DNR and an engineer to build a structure that will treat the nitrate levels at Well # 5. This system should be in operation by November of 2010.

The Village is continuously taking samples for bacteria and nitrate to both comply with code and ensure that Reedsville residents have **SAFE DRINKING WATER**.

Notes from the Village Hall

2010 Census Forms: Results from the 2010 census is used to help Reedsville get it's fair share of government funds for streets, schools and other programs we need. Without an accurate census we may not receive our fair share so the Village Board is asking you to please fill it out and return it promptly if you have not done so. If you have, we thank you!

Cat & Dog Licenses: Unspayed females and unneutered males are \$10.00 each. Spayed females and neutered males are \$5.00 each. You must show proof of a valid rabies shot. A late fee of \$15.00 shall be assessed per dog or cat for failure to obtain a license by April 1, 2010.

April Election: There will be a spring election on Tuesday, April 6th for a Court of Appeals Judge, District 2, Circuit Court Judge, Branch 1, County Executive, County Supervisor, District 16, Village Trustees, and School Board. Polls will be open at the Reedsville Municipal Building, 217 Menasha St., from 7:00 am until 8:00 pm

Chipping will done the 1^{st} & 3^{rd} Tuesday in the months of April thru October.

Clean woody vegetative material no greater than six inches (6") in diameter, and not less than four feet (4') in length can be shredded. Lumber (treated and untreated), skids, and other construction and demolition waste can not be shredded. Place near curb with cut ends facing street. If you are interested in this wood chips, the pile is located near the compost area.

Compost: Yard waste such as grass clippings, leaves, and yard & garden waste shall be disposed of by composting the material or leaving it at the Village compost site. Items NOT to be put in the compost are: stumps, roots, shrubs with intact root balls, animal waste, and sod. A sign will be erected by the compost that is ready to be used by the public.

Vehicle Nuisance: It is illegal for any partially dismantled, non-operating, wrecked, junked, unregistered or discarded vehicles to be placed or stored on any public or private property within the Village limits for a period of longer than five (5) days, unless said vehicles are stored within an enclosed building. This ordinance does not apply to property zoned for the sale or repair of vehicles. Having a vehicle behind your garage or under a tarp does not meet the requirement of an enclosed building.

Having a week to pay for the hay, I prayed everyday for money to come in, but nothing came. So the day before the check was due, my social security check was deposited and the next day I went to the bank and withdrew \$400 and put it in to the Sunrise Horse Farm account. That was a Thursday - fast forward to Saturday. We had decided to move a younger horse to a different area and for the most part everything seemed fine during the daylight hours. However, Sunday morning revealed a much different scene. Brenda came to help with the chores and found the horse was back in his usual place. How did he get there? The fences were down in three different areas. A new metal post was broken off at ground level, brackets had broken off the posts, it was a mess. Trudging through the snow with a sore leg and trying to fix fences with a hand that wasn't working too well, the tears streamed down my face. Walking back to the barn for the third time, I said "God, I'm done...all done. I'm done physically, I'm done emotionally, I'm done financially, I'm done." Walking back to the house, realizing that I will be 15 minutes late to church and asking myself if I should go, I decided I would. On the drive to church, you know how it goes, the car ahead of me was going 35mph! Now, I'll be late by 20 minutes, why don't I just turn around and go home? For some reason, I continued on, and walking into church, Pastor turned around and smiled at me and a man in front of me smiled at me as well. That was nice. After the service a man said he would like to ask me some questions and then the Pastor asked if I would be staying for coffee. After saying no, he asked me to stay a few minutes and he would be right back. Having ordered a book from him, I wondered if I had \$10 to pay for it, and if that was the reason he had asked me to stay. He came back with a check for \$100 for Sunrise Horse Farm. I was very grateful, God cared. Now, the other man asked me if we get in enough charitable contributions to cover the expenses and if not, what do we do? My reply was no and then it has to come out of my social security check. He told me you must be strapped. I just nodded my head yes. He then told me that he had something he could sell and get us some money. Driving home, I cried happy tears. God cares. Later that day, that man called and said the check would be about \$1000 and I could pick it up the next day. Totally speechless, tears filled my eyes and I agreed to meet him and picked up a check on Monday morning for \$1150. Tears filled my eyes again and I said to myself that you need to hear the whole story, which I told him, about me telling God that I'm done. He started crying before the story was finished and went on to say that as he was sitting in church he felt he had to do something to help us. Then he said, "You know it takes the Lord with a 2x4 to hit me over the head to get me to do something". And that is the story of how God showed up to say He cares. And some of you are going through difficult times.....God cares about you. The Bible says in Peter 5:7, Cast your cares on Him because He cares for you.

Dealing with the discomfort of dry skin

Has a long Wisconsin winter taken a toll on your skin? The dry air, extreme cold and wintry winds can easily dry out the skin and worsen any skin conditions you may already have.

Most dry skin problems can be minimized by using over-the-counter skin care products and by adopting a few changes to your personal skin care and bathing routine.

Why is winter extra hard on the skin? The dry (low humidity) air outside, along with the forced air of indoor heating systems, pulls moisture from the skin, encouraging it to crack, flake and peel. This increased loss of skin cells results in increased oil and water loss, leading to more dry skin.

So increasing the level of humidity in your home or office by using a humidifier is the first step to improving your dry skin.

Other causes contributing to dry skin are:

- taking long, hot showers and baths
- swimming, especially in chlorinated pools
- wearing abrasive, itchy clothing
- using harsh, drying soaps
- having bare hands and face repeatedly exposed to the elements

Dry skin can also be caused by certain bodily changes or various medical conditions, including:

- hormonal changes
- diabetes
- hypothyroidism (low thyroid function)
- side effects from treatments such as acne, allergies and rosacea
- advancing age many older people report having dry skin

Here are some tips to improve dry skin.

- Avoid taking very hot or long baths or showers. Take shorter showers or baths using warm water.
- Use mild, unscented bar soap or body wash products sparingly.
- Air-dry or gently pat dry after bathing and gently apply a moisturizer immediately.

Try one of the newer "in-shower" body lotions that are applied while showering and then rinsed off. These products take advantage of the warmth and humidity of the shower to improve skin hydration.

- Use a daily moisturizer on affected areas that is oil-based, rather than water-based. The oil creates a protective layer on the skin to help retain more moisture.
- Be sure to use a good sunscreen year round. Apply a broad-spectrum sunscreen about 30 minutes before going outside and reapply every few hours, if you stay out for an extended time.

Dry skin problems can usually be treated at home, but severe cases should be professionally evaluated. If your skin doesn't respond to at-home treatments or if the condition is especially uncomfortable or severe, seek medical help.

If you've tried at-home treatments (using moisturizers, humidifiers and milder soap) for at least two weeks without any improvement, it's time to schedule an appointment.

Thank goodness that spring, with its promise of milder temperatures and higher humidity, is right around the corner.
