## **Support Returning Service members** with a Tax Refund Donation

(MADISON) – "There'd be absolutely no way that I could keep my house and provide for my family without this," says Operation Iraqi Freedom veteran Chas Dodge of Manitowoc about the veterans' benefits and services provided by the Veterans Trust Fund (VTF).

Sgt. Dodge served for four years in the U.S. Army and for one year in the Wisconsin National Guard. He was laid off from his civilian job and unable to collect unemployment benefits. In order to provide for his young family, Dodge used the Wisconsin Department of Veterans Affairs' Veteran Education (VetEd) program to enroll in the information technology network security and business management programs at Silver Lake College. Now in his third year of college, he says about the need for support of the VTF, "I hope that other people coming home will have the same opportunity."

The VetEd reimbursement grant for education is made possible by the VTF, which is the state's primary means of supporting veterans by providing valuable services and benefits for veterans and the immediate families of service members who have died in the line of duty or as a result of service-connected disability. The fund also supports retraining grants, claims assistance, subsistence aid, and state Veterans Cemeteries.

Wisconsinites can show their support for the service of Wisconsin veterans by giving a donation to the VTF.

Donating is simply completed by entering an amount to give next to the VETS symbol on line 38d of the long form, 28d of the short form, and 64d of the nonresident/part-year resident form

### Notes from the Village Hall

Cat & Dog Licenses: Unspayed females and unneutered males are \$10.00 each. Spayed females and neutered males are \$5.00 each. You must show proof of a valid rabies shot. A late fee of \$15.00 shall be assessed per dog or cat for failure to obtain a license by April 1, 2011.

**April Election:** There will be a spring election on Tuesday, April 5th for Justice of the Supreme Court, Circuit Court Judge, Branch 3, Village President, Village Trustees, and School Board Members. Polls will be open at the Reedsville Municipal Building, 217 Menasha St., from 7:00 am until 8:00 pm

Chipping will done the 1<sup>st</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> Tuesday in the months of April thru October. Clean woody vegetative material no greater than six inches (6") in diameter, and not less than four feet (4") in length can be shredded. Lumber (treated and untreated), skids, and other construction and demolition waste can not be shredded. Place near curb with cut ends facing street. If you are interested in the wood chips, the pile is located near the compost area. Chipping for April will be April 5<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup>.

**Compost:** Yard waste such as grass clippings, leaves, and yard & garden waste shall be disposed of by composting the material or leaving it at the Village compost site. Items NOT to be put in the compost are: stumps, roots, shrubs with intact root balls, animal waste, and sod. A sign will be erected by the compost that is ready to be used by the public.

Vehicle Nuisance: It is illegal for any partially dismantled, non-operating, wrecked, junked, unregistered or discarded vehicles to be placed or stored on any public or private property within the Village limits for a period of longer than five (5) days, unless said vehicles are stored within an enclosed building. This ordinance does not apply to property zoned for the sale or repair of vehicles. Having a vehicle behind your garage or under a tarp does not meet the requirement of an enclosed building.

#### Diabetes: what you need to know

An estimated 21 million people have diabetes in the U.S., yet more than six million of those remain undiagnosed. Diabetes is a serious illness that can affect the heart, kidneys and eyes. It's a disease in which the body has trouble changing food into needed energy. As a result, levels of sugar in the blood become higher than normal. Diabetes often goes undiagnosed because its symptoms seem harmless, such as:

frequent urination

excessive thirst

extreme hunger

unusual weight loss

increased fatigue

irritability

blurry vision

If you have any of these symptoms, please see your health care provider. A blood test (A1C test) measures the average amount of sugar in your blood over the past three months.

Early detection and treatment of diabetes decreases the chance of developing serious complications. Early treatment decreases

the risk of developing eye disease, kidney disease, nerve damage and other complications.

Approximately 57 million people also have pre-diabetes, a condition that often evolves into type II diabetes. Pre-diabetes means a person's blood sugar numbers are higher than normal, but not high enough to be called diabetes.



If diagnosed with diabetes, you need to become a well informed health care consumer. This includes keeping track of your blood sugar numbers and receiving regular medical care, so you know how well your treatment plan is working.
