From the Village Hall

Sump Pumps: No discharge or overflow of storm water shall be permitted upon any street or public way from **October 1 to April 15** of each year.

Cat & Dog Licenses: Unspayed females and unneutered males are \$10.00 each. Spayed females and neutered males are \$5.00 each. You must show proof of a valid rabies shot. **A late fee of \$15.00 shall be assessed per dog or cat for failure to obtain a license by April 1, 2014.**

April Election: There will be a spring election on **Tuesday, April 1, 2014** for County Executive, County Board, District II Court of Appeals, Village Trustees, and School Board. Polls will be open at the Reedsville Municipal Building, 217 Menasha St., from 7:00 am until 8:00 pm

Cell Phones vs. Land Line Phones: Many people no longer have a land line (Frontier) phone in their homes. Cell phones are used in place of regular phones. If this is the case, please call the Village-Clerk's office at 754-4371 and let us know your phone number. Even if you have a land line phone and a cell phone, it would be helpful to have both phone numbers on file in case of an emergency.

Solid Waste and Recycling Service Reminder: Carts must be placed at least 4' apart or on separate sides of your driveway with the arrow pointing to the street. Failure to do this may result in your carts not being emptied.

Chipping will done the 1st & 3rd Tuesday in the months of April thru October. Clean woody vegetative material no greater than six inches (6") in diameter, and not less than four feet (4') in length can be shredded. Lumber (treated and untreated), skids, and other construction and demolition waste can not be shredded. Place near curb with cut ends facing street. If you are interested in the wood chips, the pile is located near the compost area. **Chipping for April will be April 1st and 15th.**

Compost: Yard waste such as grass clippings, leaves, and yard & garden waste shall be disposed of by composting the material or leaving it at the Village compost site. Items NOT to be put in the compost are: stumps, roots, shrubs with intact root balls, animal waste, and sod. A sign will be erected by the compost that is ready to be used by the public.

Vehicle Nuisance: It is illegal for any partially dismantled, non-operating, wrecked, junked, unregistered or discarded vehicles to be placed or stored on any public or private property within the Village limits for a period of longer than five (5) days, unless said vehicles are stored within an enclosed building. This ordinance does not apply to property zoned for the sale or repair of vehicles. Having a vehicle behind your garage or under a tarp does not meet the requirement of an enclosed building.

BICYCLE SAFETY



The Reedsville Police Department and the Reedsville Lions are teaming up to make Reedsville a safer place. Last fall the Reedsville Lions found out many children in Reedsville are riding bikes and do not have bicycle helmets. The Lions wanted to take action so they teamed up with the Reedsville Police Department and will be bringing bicycle safety to our community this spring. They contacted the police department and found out Chief Jo Ann Mignon and Officer Joey Tisler have conducted bicycle safety in past years. The Lions advised Chief Mignon of their concerns and asked if the department would be willing to work with them on this project. Chief Mignon then spoke with the two elementary schools about the project and they were eager to be involved. In May bicycle safety will be taught to the third grade classes and as part of that training each third grade student who resides or attends school in the Village will receive a bike helmet. The Lions received funding for the bike helmets through a sponsorship from West Bend Mutual Insurance Company and Scott Hansen Insurance Agency of Manitowoc.

Facts show bike riding is a lot of fun, but accidents happen. Every year, about 300,000 kids go to the emergency department because of bike injuries, and at least 10,000 kids have injuries that require a few days in the hospital.

The organizations are taking this prevention one step further and sponsoring a bicycle rodeo which will be open to the public on May 10, 2014 in the south elementary school parking lot from 9 a.m. to 11 a.m. Chief Mignon said our department is very happy to be teaming up these organizations and is excited to bring another level of safety to our children.

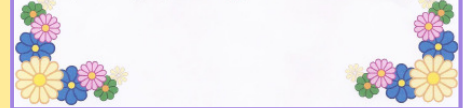

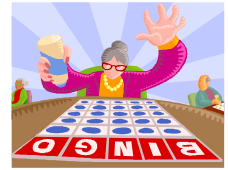

Stress test checks heart capability

Patients often ask questions about stress tests. Here's some information about this important diagnostic test. Why is this test ordered? It may be ordered to diagnose blockages in the heart vessels (coronary artery disease), diagnose heart rhythm problems or to test the effectiveness of a treatment. Your heart pumps harder and faster during exercise than it does at rest or with typical daily activities. A stress test tells us about how well your heart works during exercise. A stress test may be performed using a treadmill or stationary bike. A health care provider may order a nuclear stress test that involves radioactive dye and a special scanning machine to obtain images of the heart. This helps identify if there is an area of a patient's heart that is not receiving enough blood. Either stress test is usually done at a hospital with a physician and nurses monitoring the patient. Complications from a stress test are uncommon, but possible. If a patient is unable to exercise at all or for a long enough time to raise his or her heart rate, the health care provider may recommend the use of a medication to increase the blood flow to the coronary arteries. This is called a pharmacologic stress test. Monitoring your heart during exercise may help discover a heart problem that otherwise may not be obvious or easy to diagnose. *Denise Brilliant, NP, is a Family Nurse Practitioner at Aurora Health Center in Reedsville.
