





Stress test checks heart capability

Patients often ask questions about stress tests. Here's some information about this important diagnostic test. Why is this test ordered? It may be ordered to diagnose blockages in the heart vessels (coronary artery disease), diagnose heart rhythm problems or to test the effectiveness of a treatment. Your heart pumps harder and faster during exercise than it does at rest or with typical daily activities. A stress test tells us about how well your heart works during exercise. A stress test may be performed using a treadmill or stationary bike. A health care provider may order a nuclear stress test that involves radioactive dye and a special scanning machine to obtain images of the heart. This helps identify if there is an area of a patient's heart that is not receiving enough blood. Either stress test is usually done at a hospital with a physician and nurses monitoring the patient. Complications from a stress test are uncommon, but possible. If a patient is unable to exercise at all or for a long enough time to raise his or her heart rate, the health care provider may recommend the use of a medication to increase the blood flow to the coronary arteries. This is called a pharmacologic stress test. Moni-

toring your heart during exercise may help discover a heart problem that otherwise may not be obvious or easy to diagnose. Denise Brilliant, NP, is a Family Nurse Practitioner at Aurora Health Center in Reedsville. To schedule an appointment, call 920-754-4337.
