Camoquilt Project

The first camouflage quilt was designed and made by Linda Wieck in April of 2006. Her son-in-law, Todd, was being deployed to Iraq and asked her to make him a quilt to take along. His specifications were that it be small, made from camouflage cloth, and it needed to have cotton batting. While Todd was at Camp Shelby, MS for training prior to being deployed, other soldiers in his unit saw the quilt and wanted to buy one. Todd asked Linda if she could make each of them a quilt and they would pay her for them. She scrambled to finish all 48 before they left for Iraq in July of 2006.

After the local newspaper published an article about her work, one of the readers asked Linda to conduct a workshop to train others to make the quilts. All the money needed for materials and supplies were donated so the quilts could be given to the soldiers free of charge. As the need for more quilts grew it became clear that an occasional week-long workshop wasn't going to be enough to keep the orders filled. A need for a large, ongoing source of committed volunteers to sew quilts was there. One of Linda's volunteers is a Lutheran Women's Missionary League (LWML) member and felt that LWML could help meet that need! At the South Wisconsin District (SWD) Lutheran Womens Missionary League Fall Retreat, the Camo Quilt Project was presented as an LWML Human Care project.

Glacier Transit and Storage in Plymouth donated a facility for the camoquilt project use. *Not only* is there a loading dock and storage space but we have *an entire facility* large enough to set up a dozen sewing machines with a separate room for cutting. GTS has donated this area for as long as we need it *including the heat and electricity*. Now we have space for volunteers to drop in and work! We'd love to see you, so stop by and say hi.

One of our most-asked questions is, "Doesn't the military provide them with a quilt?" The answer, sadly, is no. Military-issued sleeping bags are bulky and hot and must be carried inside their back-packs. Our Camo Quilt is so popular because it's made from the same camouflage material as the uniforms. That means it can be used in the open, tied to the outside of a soldier's kit, leaving precious room inside for personal items. The camouflage quilt is a small quilt measuring approximately 45" x 72". The quilt folds in thirds and rolls up like a sleeping bag. It is lightweight and has cotton batting so it breathes better in the extreme heat. These quilts are slept on and slept under; they protect the soldiers from the harsh elements they face, both cold winter nights and hot daytime sun. They are even used for pillows. Any person serving in the military and deployed to the Middle East is eligible to receive one of **these quilts!** Each quilt is packaged with a cool tie and a hand-made card. The card gives information about the volunteer group and is signed by some of the volunteers. This gives our quilts a very personal touch! There is **no charge** to the soldiers for the quilts. We just ask that the person requesting the quilts cover the cost of shipping. Volunteers have made and distributed over 1,000 quilts to Soldiers and Marines! **Get Involved -** Donations can be sent to Franklin Legion Post 387 c/o Steven Bender, N7417 Bittersweet Road, Plymouth, WI 53073. 100% of donated money is used directly for the quilts we make! COOL THE FIRE OF ANGER FOR BETTER HEALTH AND HAPPIER RELATIONSHIPS

Student athletes reminded to get physicals before fall sports.

Parents and guardians of high school athletes are reminded to schedule a sports physical appointment for their student in time for the fall season.

Every two years, it is required that students who are involved in high school athletics have a sports physical and hand in a signed examination card from a health care provider.

The WIAA, or Wisconsin Interscholastic Athletic Association, has strict guidelines about the sports physicals students need to complete in order to practice or participate in athletics.

During these physicals, health care providers like myself discuss and examine a student's overall health and family medical history to make sure there are no underlying health conditions that may prevent them from safely participating in sports.

I also perform a scoliosis screening during these exams. Scoliosis is a condition affecting the spine, which can develop during puberty. Normally, a spine should be straight as one bends over in order to naturally absorb stress in your back. However, a person with scoliosis has an 'S' or 'C' curve in their spine, which can affect how he or she plays sports.

A physical examination taken April 1 or later is valid for the following two school years; a physical examination taken before April 1 is valid only for the remainder of that school year and the following school year.

WIAA physical cards are available at Aurora Health Center in Reedsville. Parents should complete the health history section and sign the cards prior to their student athletes' appointment.

Kidde Recalls Dual Sensor Smoke Alarms Can Fail to Warn of a Fire

WASHINGTON, D.C. - The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission, in cooperation with the firm named below, today announced a voluntary recall of the following consumer product. Consumers should stop using recalled products immediately unless otherwise instructed.

Name of Product: Kidde Model PI2000 Dual Sensor Smoke Alarm Units: About 94,000

Manufacturer: Walter Kidde Portable Equipment Inc., of Mebane, N.C. Hazard: An electrostatic discharge can damage the unit, causing it not to warn consumers of a fire.

Incidents/Injuries: The firm has received two reported incidents of smoke alarm malfunctions involving electrostatic discharge during installation. No injuries have been reported.

Description: This recall involves Kidde dual sensor smoke alarms model PI2000. The alarms can be identified by two buttons, "HUSH" and "PUSH AND HOLD TO TEST WEEKLY," which are located on the front/center of the alarm. The model number and date code are on the back of the smoke alarm. Only date codes 2008 Aug.01 through 2009 May 04 are included in this recall.

Sold at: Retail, department, and hardware stores and through electrical distributors nationwide from August 2008 through May 2009 for between \$30 and \$40.

Manufactured in: China

Remedy: Consumers should contact Kidde immediately to receive a free replacement smoke alarm.
