Notes from the Village Hall

Effective September 1, 2010, residential and business electronics such as computers, monitors, TV and other video display devices, fax machines, DVD and VCR players, printers, and cell phones will be banned from landfills and incineration. Manufacturers are now responsible for collecting and recycling those electronics from households and schools. Computers, computer accessories, televisions, cell phones, and other electronics contain harmful materials including lead, mercury, cadmium, other heavy metals, and chemical flame retardants. When disposed of illegally, these chemicals can leach into the environment where they may affect human and environmental health. These items can be disposed of at the Manitowoc County Recycling Center located at 3000 Basswood Road, Manitowoc, WI for a small fee.

Prepare for your vacation beforehand

Here are some health-related travel tips to keep in mind, especially if you are planning to travel abroad:

Before you leave the country, check to see which immunizations may be needed.

Check in with your health care provider, especially if you have a chronic medical condition. Discuss ways to handle any on-going medical conditions that may be affected by travel.

Be sure to bring an adequate amount of all required medications and medical supplies. Keep these items with you in your "carry-on" bag while traveling by air. Leave them in their original containers or packages.

It's a good idea to check the Transportation Security Administration (www.tsa.gov) website for the newest updates on permitted and prohibited items, including medicines that you are allowed to carry onto an airplane.

When traveling to other countries, it may be helpful to carry a letter that is signed and dated by your health care provider on letterhead stationary. This letter should clearly state your need for all prescription medications and any special medical equipment (particularly for syringes if you are diabetic). Otherwise these items may be confiscated at border crossings as suspected contraband or illicit drugs.

Consider carrying a medical alert card or wearing a medical alert bracelet or necklace that clearly identifies your condition.

Taking these simple steps while traveling will help ensure a safe and memorable trip. Bon voyage!

And, don't forget, if you need a physical before school starts, make an appointment early!



\$12.00 - per tractor tire


Quantities of 6 or more tires will be weighed and charged 9 cents per pound or \$180/ton.
