

This historic Irish settlement of Maple Grove and Franklin townships accounted for over 43% of the Irish in Manitowoc County in the 1880's, and was one of the largest Irish settlements in Wisconsin. Maple Grove is located at the intersection of County Tr. G and Taus Rd. The event will include kids games, adult games, a group of young Irish Dancers, Sisters' Kitchen full of sweets and goodies, a kolache making demonstration with sales of the freshly baked kolaches, a large Silent Auction, featuring a football autographed by the i Super Bowl Winners, the Green Bay Packers, Chicken booyah, brats, hamburgers, refreshments, and fresh produce. The Irish Dancers will be performing in the early afternoon and there will be musical entertainment for rest of the afternoon. A raffle will be held with monetary prizes of \$400, 2-\$100, 2-\$50, and 2-\$25. With a total of \$750 payout. Ticket prices are \$1.00 each or 6 for \$5.00 and are available from members or by calling (920) 732-3462. Tickets will also be available on the grounds the day of the picnic. Drawing for the winning tickets will be held at 4:30 P.M. on the picnic day. Winners need not be present to win. In addition, there will be genealogical search help available. 

Learning with arthritis

Arthritis is a general term referring to many rheumatic diseases that cause pain, stiffness and swelling in joints and other connective tissues. More than 100 different illnesses can cause arthritis and impact supporting structures such as muscles, tendons, ligaments and other parts of the body.

Osteoarthritis is the most prevalent type of arthritis. According to the Arthritis Foundation, osteoarthritis is a very common condition of aging, impacting nearly 50 million Americans.

People with osteoarthritis usually have joint pain and limited movement. There is no single treatment program that applies to all people with arthritis. Each case is different.

If diagnosed with arthritis, your health care provider may recommend a combination of treatments, including medications for pain relief, rest and relaxation, proper diet and weight management and exercise.

Physical and / or occupational therapy has been shown to reduce the painful symptoms of inflammation, help prevent deformity and permanent joint stiffness and maintain strength in the surrounding muscles.

To reduce your chances of developing arthritis:

- maintain a healthy weight
- do regular, gentle exercise, including walking, stretching and yoga
- avoid repetitive motions and risky activities that may contribute to joint injury, especially after age



Obtaining a proper diagnosis, managing pain and controlling the disease long term are the keys to helping people with arthritis learn to live well with their condition.

FROM THE REEDSVILLE POLICE DEPARTMENT *Road closed:* Residents will be affected by the Hwy 10 road closure

starting the week of July 15 and continuing into late August. At times this construction may become frustrating and tiresome but the Reedsville Police Department is asking for your cooperation during the process. All residents will be able to travel north and south across Hwy 10 to get to residents or businesses in the affected area but the entire length of Hwy 10 from Cty W to east of Pleasentview road will be closed. If you need to get to a residence or business on Hwy 10 during the construction you will be allowed to do so using the shortest route of travel possible. The barriers and detour are set up as a safety measure for crews working in the area and should someone move or travel around a barricade they could be cited and receive a fine. We will have patrol officers in the area regularly to ensure the safety of all traveling or working in the affected area. Please remember people who normally travel Hwy 10 will be using alternative routes during the construction and there may be increased traffic near your home. There is a posted detour which directs traffic around the Village but we have found during construction many chose to travel through local cities or villages rather than use the posted detour. We have no problem with this and hope all will obey the posted speed limits in your neighborhoods. Should you have any traffic problems or concerns during the construction please feel free to contact us at (920) 754-4656 or pdjoe@reedsville.org. There is also a Department of Transportation project office site set up in the Reedsville Fire Station parking lot at 100 Industrial Drive, Reedsville WI 54230. There will be a site manager at this location usually between 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday to Friday to answer any questions you may have. Our goal is to assist residents and the Department of Transportation and return to normal travel as soon as possible. To keep everyone informed during the project we plan to post weekly construction updates on the new Village of Reedsville website at www.reedsville.org.

A meeting of the Reedsville Village Board was called to order on June 6, 2013 at 6:30 PM by Village President Andy Bubolz. Present were: Bob Campana, Ryan Lorrigan, Mary Olson, Jerry Reis, and Jack Siebert. Also present were: Brad Busse, Melanie Hills, Cory Kiekhaefer, Leroy Krepline, JoAnn Mignon, Mike O'Connell, Kyle Johnson, Andy Pantzlaff, and Craig Schuh

The minutes of the previous meeting of May 16, 2013 were approved as presented.

A motion was made by Olson and seconded by Siebert to pay the accounts payable in the amount of \$34,263.61. Motion carried 5-0. Johnson explained the proposal for the lighting analysis from Total

Maintenance Solutions.

A motion was made by Olson and seconded to cancel the 1st meeting of July (July 4th). Motion carried 5-0. A motion was made by Reis and seconded by Siebert to allow a display for the Taus 4-H and the Shoot for Coop event to be placed on Hwy 10. Motion carried 5-0.

A written report was presented Police Department.

A discussion was held on lawn cutting of empty lots. The Village will try to find someone to cut these lots.

A written report was presented by the Police, Utility and Fire Departments.

A motion was made by Campana and seconded by Siebert to approve the resignation from Dean Bubolz from the Fire Department. Motion carried 5-0. A motion was made by Lorrigan and seconded by Reis to sell the 2006 Fire Engine to the Rockland Fire Dept in the amount of \$130,000.00. Motion carried 4-1 (Olson opposed).
