Sunrise...

What's in a name? Sunrise alludes to hope, to a new day dawning, it's fresh and it's waiting. Anticipation stirs and calls my senses, draws me in...there's something to be discovered...maybe even unearthed. Like the name it bears, Sunrise Horse Farm lies in wait, patiently stretching forth as it calls to those who visit. Is it courage, is it safety, is it acceptance, is it kindness. What is it that hearts really need? Safety? Security? A place where it's built-up instead of torn down. Like a sunrise that offers hope, Sunrise Horse Farm is a safe haven to give hope a place to grow. We are just getting acquainted. But today he seemed particularly ok with me and chose to approach me on his own stretching his head and neck as he walked until his whiskers brushed up against me. He too grew in his courage as he chose to trust someone he can't even see. Hope...Restoration... ## Measles making headlines

Its been in the news: measles is still a health concern. Measles can be serious and even fatal, especially for small children. While death rates have been falling worldwide as more children are vaccinated, the disease still kills more than 100,000 people a year, most under age of five.

According to the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), measles is a highly contagious disease. It can be serious for young children, so protect your child by making sure he or she is vaccinated.

Measles spreads through the air when an infected person coughs or sneezes. Its so contagious that if one person has it, 90% of the people nearby will also become infected if they are not protected. Signs and symptoms of measles include cough, runny nose, inflamed eyes, sore throat, fever and a red, blotchy skin rash.

People in this country still get measles, but it's not very common. That's because most people in this country are protected against measles through vaccination. Today, the United States averages about 60 cases of measles each year, and most originate outside the country.

However, since measles is still common in parts of Europe, Asia, the Pacific, and Africa, measles can be brought into the United States by people who get infected while abroad.

According to the CDC, getting vaccinated is much safer that putting your child (or yourself) at risk by not being vaccinated.

#### ANTIBIOTIC GUIDELINES TOO OFTEN IGNORED

A report from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention revealed that up to 50% of antibiotic prescriptions are unwarranted and ineffective. An update was given on the lawn cutting and the 5<sup>th</sup> Street Repair project. The Board members are asked to review these items for the next meeting. Cost to repair the restrooms in the Firemen's Park will be obtained for the 2015 budget.

A motion was made by Campana and seconded by Siebert to appoint Lorrigan as the contact person for the Deerview Drive Extension Project. Motion carried 3-0. (Bubolz abstained from the conversation). A motion was made by Campana and seconded by Siebert to approve the Survey, Base Mapping, and Preliminary Engineering Contract from Ayres Associates in the lump sum amount of \$10.850.00 Motion carried 3-0

Krepline gave an update on equipment, the 3<sup>rd</sup> Street curb and gutter request and the slurry seal project. Bubolz, Kiekhaefer, and Krepline will view a dump truck displayed on the Wisconsin Surplus auction site.
