## Adults need vaccines, too!

You never outgrow the need for vaccines. The specific immunizations that adults require are determined by factors such as age, lifestyle, high-risk conditions, type and destinations of travel and personal immunization history.

Throughout their lifespan adults need immunizations to protect against pertussis, tetanus, diphtheria, mumps, pneumonia, HPV, chickenpox, shingles, and influenza.

Pertussis: Most people were vaccinated against pertussis (whopping cough) as children. The Centers for Disease Control (CDC) recommends that adults receive a pertussis booster shot to strengthen their lifetime immunity.

If you receive a tetanus-diphtheria (Td) booster every 10 years as recommended, you won't need an extra shot for pertussis. Vaccine makers have added a pertussis component to that booster vaccine (Tdap), which is recommended for all parents and grandparents in an effort to prevent children from developing pertussis.

Other vaccines adults may need:

- Mumps vaccine: Check with your health care provider to see if you need a MMR booster.
- Pneumococcal vaccine (pneumonia shot): Recommended for adults 65 years and older and others with specific health conditions.
- HPV vaccine (human papillomavirus): HPV vaccines are given as a series of three shots over a six-month period. There three different HPV vaccines; the CDC indicates the vaccines can be received through age 26 among females. Commonly known as a preventative measure against developing cervical cancer, two of the HPV vaccines can also protect against genital warts and anal cancer in males and females. Young men can get vaccinated through age 21. The vaccine is also recommended for any homosexual man through age 26, and for men with compromised immune systems (including HIV) through the age of 26, if they did not get the HPV vaccine when they were younger.
- The same virus that causes chickenpox causes shingles. A shingles vaccine helps protect those age 60 and older.

And finally, adults looking to avoid the flu should receive an annual flu vaccination.






