A. While enjoying outdoor activities this summer it's important to protect our skin and know how to treat common skin irritations.

#### Sun safety

- Dress in cool, comfortable clothing that covers the body, including hats.
- Limit sun exposure between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.
- Wear sunglasses with at least 99% UV protection.
- · Use sunscreen and SPF lip balm.

Buzz off—Insect repellents can help prevent insect bites, but not from stinging insects. Use repellents with 10% to 30% DEET on anyone older than two months. You can also use repellants with picaridin. Don't get ticked!-Dress your kids in long-sleeved shirts and tuck their pants into socks. Check for ticks nightly. Remove a tick by lightly gripping it with tweezers near its head, close to the skin. Pull it off without crushing it. Clean the area and apply an antiseptic.

For bee stings, push out the stinger using a blunt-edged object such as a credit card. Clean the wound with soap and water, then apply a cool compress.

Poison Ivy—Wash exposed areas with soap and water within five to 10 minutes of contact to prevent a breakout. Apply calamine lotion to ease itching. If the rash starts oozing or the skin is swelling, seek medical help.



#### **Proceedings of the Reedsville Village Board** May 11, 2017

The monthly meeting of the Reedsville Village Board was called to order on May 11, 2017 at 6:30 PM by Village President Geoff Weinreis. Present were: Joe Cummings, Jerry Reis, Jack Siebert and Jesse Walt: Also present were: Brad Busse, Melanie Hills, Leroy Krepline, Rob Michaelson, Craig Schuh, John Schuh, Joe Tisler, Mary Olson, Frank Burke, Becky Busse, Jeremy Foytik, and Vern Bauknecht.

The minutes of the previous meeting of April 13, 2017 were approved as presented.

A motion was made by Reis and seconded by Walt to pay the accounts payable in the amount of \$151.097.30. Motion carried 4-0.

Correspondence was presented from the WI Dept of Safety and Professional Services. A motion was made by Siebert and seconded by Reis to approve the Operator License Applications from Cassie Collins, Kay Teschendorf and Cheryl Brazil. Motion carried 4-0

The First Responders monthly written report was presented by Hills.

The Police Dept. monthly written report was presented by Tisler.

The Utility Departments monthly written report was presented by Michaelson. A motion was made by Siebert and seconded by Cummings to award the Water Tower Painting Project to Classic Protective Coatings Inc of Menomonie in the amount of \$208,950.00. Motion carried 3-1 (Nay Reis). A motion was made by Siebert and seconded by Reis to have Speedy Clean do the mainline repairs in an amount not to exceed \$10,000.00. Motion carried 4 -0. An update was given on the Lift Station pump repairs.

The Fire Dept. verbal monthly report was presented by Busse. The Board went outside to view the Fire Dept Pick-up that went into service in September of 2016.

A discussion was held regarding the Dog Park. A new location was suggested and the REDC will go and view the location. Following a discussion letters will be going out on Monday to the property owners who need to cut their lawns

A motion was made by Siebert and seconded by Cummings to approve the loan for the Fire Department from the Denmark State Bank in an amount not to exceed \$27,500.00 at 3.5% coming due on or before January 31, 2018. First draw will be for \$7,000.33. Motion carried 4-0. A motion was made by Reis and seconded by Siebert to have the Village Attorney draft the items needed to participate in the HRA program in an amount not to exceed \$900.00. Motion carried 4-0. Resolution 2017-2 regarding the 3rd party signature was introduced by Siebert. A motion was made by Walt and seconded by Cummings to approve the Resolution as presented. Motion carried 3-0 (Reis abstained). Krahn gave an update on Use Permit fees collected.

A discussion was held on the 4th Street Bridge project and the need to have a contact person who we can talk to as the project goes on. The following items were accepted as proposed: curb ramp, storm sewer, vertical curve, sight distance, curb radii and bicycle facilities. Weinreis gave an update on his presentation to the 3rd grade students at the Reedsville Elementary School and their wish to have a plague put up for the first Village President William Henry Nobel. A motion was made by Cummings and seconded by Siebert to spend up to \$300.00 for the plague. Motion carried 4-0. A discussion on repairs to Sunset Drive was postponed until the next regular scheduled meeting. The next regular monthly meeting will be held on Thursday, June 8, 2017 at 6:30 PM.
