### **February Spring Primary Election**

There will be Spring Primary Election on Tuesday, February 21, 2012 for Reedsville School Board. Polls will be open at the Reedsville Municipal Building, 217 Menasha St. from 7:00 am until 8:00 pm.

#### **NEW CHANGES FOR VOTING:**



Beginning in 2012: Voters cannot receive a ballot until you have met the photo ID requirement: You will need to present an accepted form of photo ID (Wisconsin Drivers License). If you do not have a

driver's license, you may obtain a free ID for purposes of voting at a Dept. of Motor Vehicle office. Voters must sign the poll book to obtain a ballot. Voters unable to sign the poll book because of a physical disability are exempt.

#### **Voter Registration Information**

The federal Help America Vote Act of 2002 (HAVA) and Wisconsin State Statutes require all voters in Wisconsin to be registered in order to vote after January 1, 2006. You can register to vote up until the Friday before the election or on Election Day. You must reside at your address for 28 consecutive days to be eligible to vote and proof of residence is required.





### Zion Methodist Reedsville Begins 100th Year Celebration!

Sunday, January 29th marks the beginning of the 100th year celebration at the Zion United Methodist Church in Reedsville.

The first organizational meeting for the "little church on the corner" of Reedsville's main street took place on May 8th, 1912.
Rev. W.A. Detert was the chairman.
Elected officers at the meeting included A.B. Reichert, L.A. Busse, and Albert Fischer.

After approval by the conference in June, actual construction of the building began in late summer of 1912 at a cost of \$4,000 which was raised by faithful worshipers whose families continue to actively support the church today.

Former pastors and past members have been invited to attend the 100th Anniversary Celebration of the Zion Methodist Church on Sunday, April 29th at 9 a.m.
A family style dinner will follow at Cobblestone, Brillion, at 11:30 a.m.

There will be displays of church memorabilia, confirmation pictures dating from 1915 - 1995, as well as photo albums documenting church history.

### Asthma is not just for kids

Asthma symptoms can start at any age. Approximately one in 12 adults are diagnosed with the disease.

Asthma is a serious, chronic disease that affects the lungs and narrows the airways that deliver air to the lungs. Although symptoms of asthma sometimes vary, telltale signs usually include tightness in the chest, a persistent, irritable cough, wheezing, and shortness of breath or feeling like your lungs are "bloated."

Asthma causes symptoms when the bronchial tubes become narrowed. An asthma "attack" begins when the airways become inflamed in response to a trigger, such as pollen, dust, animal dander, mold, exercise, cold air, smoke or other illnesses. When the airway becomes tight, it is hard to get air to pass in and out of your lungs and you continue to have a harder time breathing with each breath attempt.

Asthma attacks can be mild, moderate or severe. Depending on the severity of the disease, treatment options include the use of anti-inflammatory medications, steroids, bronchodilators and inhalers.

To help control the disease:

- Eliminate household pets, if necessary.
- Vacuum / dust regularly.
- Replace carpeting with wood or tile floors, especially in bedrooms.
- Cover bedding and pillows with airtight, hypo-allergenic covers.
- Cover your nose and mouth with a scarf or mask in cold
- Avoid direct contact when people are coughing or ill.
- Use your maintenance inhalers as prescribed by your health care provider.

Asthma can be controlled. However, this requires being well educated about the disease and being an active partner in managing it.

### **How Can I Get Home Delivered Meals?**

Manitowoc County offers a wonderful service to eligible individuals that many may not be aware of, Home Delivered Meals. Home Delivered Meals are available anywhere in the county. Eligibility guidelines are as follows:

- A person aged 60 years of age or older who is frail and essentially homebound (does not leave home under normal circumstances, flexibility is allowed for appointments), or a spouse of an eligible person regardless of age or condition.
- A disabled individual who resides at home with an eligible older individual participating in the program.
- The person is unable to participate in the congregate meals program because of physical or emotional problems.
- There is no spouse or other adult living in the same house or building willing to prepare meals and the individual is unable to physically or emotionally obtain food and prepare adequate meals.

Meals are available to all qualifying individuals on a donation basis regardless of income. For more information about eligibility and how to get signed up please feel free to call the Aging & Disability Resource Center at 683-4180.
