## Is it the flu or just a cold?

As we head into winter, it's helpful to know the differences between flu and cold symptoms.

A cold is a milder respiratory illness than the flu. Flu symptoms can make you feel quite ill for a week or even longer and result in serious health problems such as pneumonia, hospitalizations and other complications, including death.

Cold symptoms usually last for about a week. During the first three days that you exhibit cold symptoms, you are contagious.

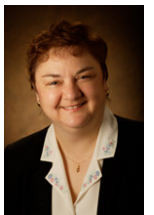
In general, flu symptoms are usually more severe than cold symptoms and tend to come on quickly. Typical flu symptoms include sore throat, fever, headache, muscle aches and soreness, congestion and cough.

A common cold rarely produces a fever above 101 degrees. With the flu you'll probably have a fever initially and you will likely feel miserable. Body and muscle aches are also more common with the flu.

It's very important to keep your hands germ-free with frequent washing to prevent both flu and cold symptoms. Wash your hands by rubbing them together with warm soapy water for at least 20 seconds to help remove any germs from the skin.

Getting a flu vaccine to prevent seasonal influenza will help you stay healthy this winter. Within two weeks of getting the flu vaccine, antibodies develop in the body and begin providing protection against flu. Protect yourself and those you love by getting immunized today!

**Payment of Property Taxes:**

- Real estate and personal property tax payments can be made in person at the Reedsville Municipal Building during normal business hours.
- Payments may also be made by sending a check to the following: Reedsville Municipal Building, Tax Collection, 217 Menasha St., Reedsville, WI 54230-8597. Taxes paid by check or money order must be made payable to the Village of Reedsville. **Cash will not be accepted.** A receipt will only be sent back if you have included a self-addressed stamped envelope.
- **NEW for 2014:** You can now pay your taxes on-line at <https://client.pointandpay.net/web/VillageofReedsvilleWIWeb> This address can also be found on the Reedsville Website under Links.

All first installment taxes are due by January 31, 2015.

**Cat & Dog Licenses:** Unspayed females and unneutered males are \$10.00 each. Spayed females and neutered males are \$5.00 each. You must show proof of a valid rabies shot. Please make out a separate check for the licenses as it goes into a different account.

**Purchase a Brick:** Become a part of the Bubolz Memorial Park by purchasing a brick for the Memorial Walk. The high quality, custom-engraved brick can be personalized with names and/ or messages to commemorate your family, a loved one, your business or a special pet. The order form with prices and sizes can be obtained in the Reedsville Municipal Building Hall or on the Reedsville Website.

**Clerk/Treasurer's Office Hours:** Monday thru Thursday, 8:00 AM to 3:00 PM and Friday 8:00 am to 1:00 pm. **The office will be closed December 18<sup>th</sup> thru December 26<sup>th</sup> and January 1<sup>st</sup> and at noon on December 31<sup>st</sup>.**

**Recycling Pick-Up:** January 2<sup>nd</sup>, 16<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup>

**Snow & Ice Removal:** The owner or occupant of any lot abutting on a public sidewalk shall clear their sidewalk of snow within twenty-four (24) hours after a snowfall and keep the same free of ice. If such snow or ice is not removed as required herein, the Street Dept. shall cause the same to be done and the cost thereof assessed against the property owner

**Utility Bill Payment Services:**

You can use your credit/debit card or go on-line at

- You can have your utility payment deducted automatically from your checking or savings account. The application form is available on the website under *Forms and Permits*, in the Reedsville Municipal Building lobby or the Denmark State Bank – Reedsville office.

**Building Permits:** A building permit is required for any structural or major changes in excess of \$300.00 to your home or property. Permits cost \$20.00 for the first \$2,000 of material and labor costs and \$2.00 for each additional \$1,000 of costs after that. Building Permits are good for 6 months. The application form is available on the website under *Forms and Permits* or in the Reedsville Municipal Building lobby. Permits can be obtained at the Clerk-Treasurer office located at 217 Menasha Street.

## ELECTRONICS PRICING CHANGE

Beginning January 1, 2015 The Manitowoc County Recycling Center will adjust the recycling charges on a number of items accepted under the electronics collection program.

Please call 920-683-4333 for a list of items/fees or visit the Manitowoc County Recycling Center website at [www.manitowocrecycles.org](http://www.manitowocrecycles.org).

All televisions and monitors are measured diagonally across the glass portion of the screen. Televisions and monitors must not be broken or stripped. Due to the increased health and safety issues associated with handling, storing and transporting stripped electronics or broken televisions, these items may be refused or assessed an extra fee depending on the situation.

The Manitowoc County Recycling Center is registered with the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources as a certified electronics collector. This means that ALL the electronics recycled through our program are sent to reputable recycling companies who guarantee the confidential destruction of any personal data remaining on your electronics, recycle or reuse all of the materials they receive, and are registered with the Environmental Protection Association and Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources.
