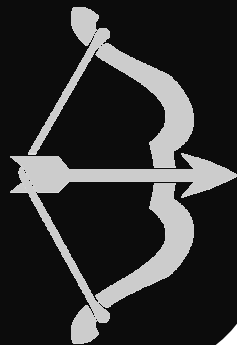

Come out to enjoy the chili and the game!



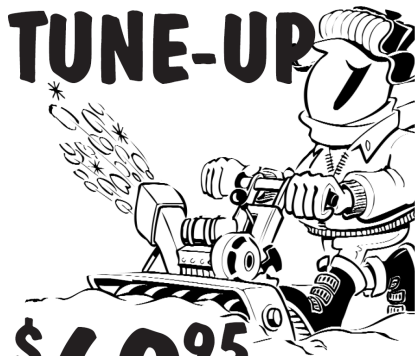

Payment of Property Taxes:

- Real estate and personal property tax payments can be made in person at the Reedsville Municipal Building during normal business hours.
- Payments may also be made by sending a check to the following: Reedsville Municipal Building, Tax Collection, 217 Menasha St., Reedsville, WI 54230-8597. Taxes paid by check or money order must be made payable to the Village of Reedsville. **Cash will not be accepted.** A receipt will only be sent back if you have included a self-addressed stamped envelope.
- You can pay your taxes on-line at <https://client.pointandpay.net/web/VillageofReedsvilleWIWeb> This address can also be found on the Reedsville Website under Links.

All first installment taxes are due on or before January 31, 2017.

Cat & Dog Licenses: Unspayed females and unneutered males are \$10.00 each. Spayed females and neutered males are \$5.00 each. You must show proof of a valid rabies shot. Please make out a separate check for the licenses as it goes into a different account.

Holiday Tree Drop-off: Manitowoc County residents and business may drop off their natural holiday trees at the Basswood Compost Site from 7:00 am to 4:00 pm, Monday through Friday, and Saturdays from 8:00 am until noon. Please remove all ornaments, tinsel, lights, stands and storage bags before dropping off. If the tree is more than 6 feet long, it must be cut in half. The Basswood compost is located at 3000 Basswood Rd., near the intersection of County Road P and R. Call 683-4333 or visit www.manitowocrecycles.org for additional information. **The Village does not pick up or chip Christmas Trees**

Clerk/Treasurer's Office Hours: Monday thru Thursday, 8:00 AM to 3:00 PM and Friday 8:00 am to Noon 12:00 pm. **Clerk-Treasurer's office will be closed December 19th thru December 26th, 2016.**

Reedsville Municipal Building will be closed all day December 23rd, 26th and January 2nd and at noon on December 30th for the holidays.

Recycling Pick-Up: January 13th and 27th

Snow & Ice Removal: The owner or occupant of any lot abutting on a public sidewalk shall clear their sidewalk of snow within twenty-four (24) hours after a snowfall and keep the same free of ice. If such snow or ice is not removed as required herein, the Street Dept. shall cause the same to be done and the cost thereof assessed against the property owner

Utility Bill Payment Services:

You can use your credit/debit card or go on-line at

- You can have your utility payment deducted automatically from your checking or savings account. The application form is available on the website under *Forms and Permits*, in the Reedsville Municipal Building lobby or the Denmark State Bank – Reedsville office.

Building Permits: A building permit is required for any structural or major changes in excess of \$300.00 to your home or property. Permits cost \$20.00 for the first \$2,000 of material and labor costs and \$2.00 for each additional \$1,000 of costs after that. Building Permits are good for 6 months. The application form is available on the website under *Forms and Permits* or in the Reedsville Municipal Building lobby. Permits can be obtained at the Clerk-Treasurer office located at 217 Menasha Street.

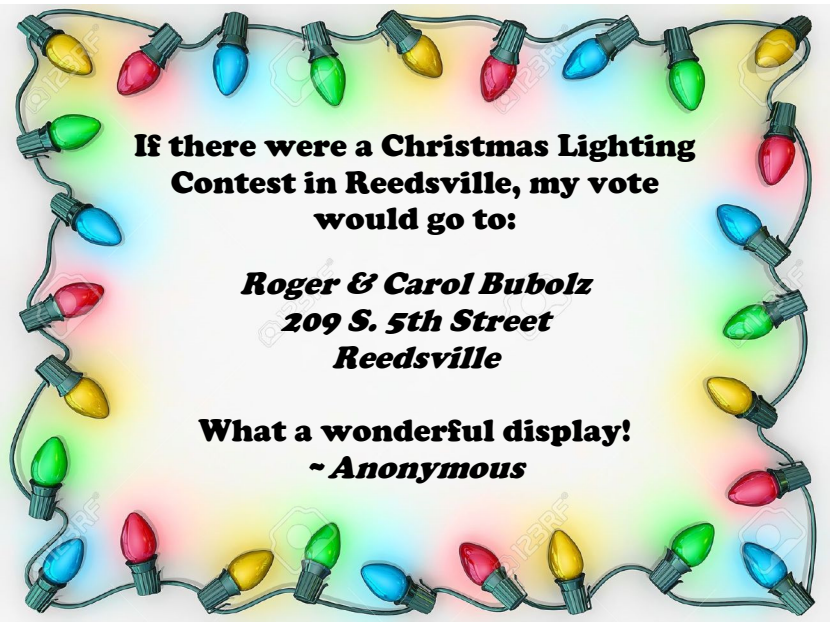

CHRISTMAS AT SUNRISE HORSE FARM

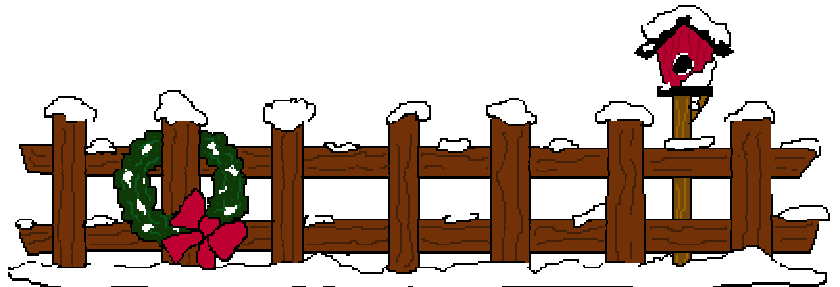

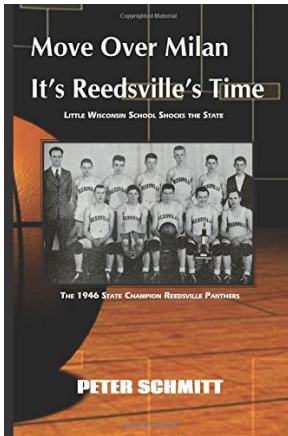

Proceedings of the Reedsville Village Board October 13, 2016

The monthly meeting of the Reedsville Village Board was called to order on October 13, 2016 at 6:00 PM by Village President Andy Bubolz. Present were: Ryan Lorrigan (arrived at 6:10 PM), Jerry Reis, and Jack Siebert. Board went to view Village concerns. Board returned at 6:30 pm. (Jesse Walt arrived at 6:30 pm): Also present were: Brad Busse, Melanie Hills, Leroy Krepline, Nick Ponto, Craig Schuh, Joe Tisler, John Schuh, Rob Michaelson, Bill Bratz, Jim Dallman and Doug Bubolz.

The minutes for the meetings of September 8, 2016 and September 26, 2016 were approved as presented.

A motion was made by Siebert and seconded by Lorrigan to pay the accounts payable in the amount of \$173,156.66. Motion carried 3-0 (Walt abstained).

At 7:15 pm, a motion was made by Reis and seconded by Siebert to convene into closed session pursuant to WI Statute Section 19.85(1) (f) to consider data of specific persons. Motion carried 4-0. At 7:20 pm, a motion was made by Lorrigan and seconded by Reis to reconvene into open session. Motion carried 4-0.

At 7:20 pm a motion was made by Walt and seconded by Siebert to convene into closed session, pursuant to WI Statute Section 19.85(1) (i) to discuss matters which if discussed in public, could adversely affect the business matter. At 7:50 pm a motion was made by Siebert and seconded by Walt to reconvene into open session. Motion carried 4-0.

Correspondence was presented. A motion was made by Siebert and seconded by Lorrigan to approve the Temporary Class B License Application from the Reedsville Fire Fighters. Motion carried 3-0 (Walt abstained). A motion was made by Reis and seconded by Siebert to approve the Operator License Application from Colleen Cummings. Motion carried 4-0. A motion was made by Reis and seconded by Lorrigan to approve the 2017 Law Enforcement Agreement with the City of Brillion in the amount of \$28,100.00. Motion carried 4-0. A motion was made by Lorrigan and seconded by Walt to approve the proposal from Town Web Design in the amount of \$529.00 with update being done in 2016 and paid in 2017. Motion carried 4-0. An update was given on Mercury Network. The discussion on the Water discount request was postponed until the meter could be read at the end of October.

The First Responders monthly written reports were presented by Hills.

The Police Dept. monthly written report was presented by Tisler. The

update on the temporary sign placement was postponed until the next regular scheduled meeting.

The Utility Departments monthly written report was presented by Ponto. Michaelson gave an update on the water and sewer 2017 proposed budgets

The Fire Dept. monthly verbal report was presented by Busse. A motion was made by Lorrigan and seconded by Siebert to approve the purchase from Jefferson Fire in the amount of \$4,762.05. Motion carried 3-0 (Walt abstained).

Following a discussion, a motion was made by Lorrigan and seconded by Reis to have Krepline clean out the ditch and catch basin and to survey the pipe located on Mill Street for drainage and report back to the Board at the next regular scheduled meeting for further discussion. Motion carried 4-0. The Police Dept. will create an ordinance preventing grass clipping from being put on the streets.

A motion was made by Reis and seconded by Lorrigan to approve the Street Closure Application as presented and to send the application to the individuals/groups who requested a closure in 2016. Motion carried 4-0. Bubolz turned the meeting over to Lorrigan to view the Land Lease bids received at 7:45 pm. A motion was made by Reis and seconded by Siebert to award Dan Dvorachek Bid #1 (\$1,700.00/yr.) and Bid #2 (\$1,965.60/yr.). Motion carried 4-0. Lorrigan turned the meeting back to Bubolz at 7:50 pm. The Budget Public Hearing will be set for November 10, 2016 at 7:00 pm. Following a discussion a motion was made by Lorrigan and seconded by Walt to deny the request from the Reedsville Housing Authority to plow their parking lot. Board suggested they bid out this service. Motion carried 4-0. A motion was made by Reis and seconded by Lorrigan to send a letter to the individual stating they had until November 1, 2016 to pay their delinquent personal property taxes or legal action would be taken. Motion carried 4-0.

A motion was made by Lorrigan and seconded by Sievert to forgive the balance of the Bubolz Memorial Park Equipment loan. Motion carried 3-1 (Nay – Reis). More information needs to be obtained on the Dog Park project.

The next regular monthly meeting will be held on Thursday, November 10, 2016 at 6:30 PM. A motion was made by Reis and seconded by Walt to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried 4-0. Meeting adjourned at 8:37 PM.
