FOR BETTER HEALTH, DRINK MORE WATER

Most people in America don't drink enough water. They drink coffee, tea, soda, energy drinks, fruit juice, alcohol, milk and just about everything except water. Notes from the Village Hall

Village Trustee Vacancy: The Village of Reedsville is accepting applications to fill a Village Trustee vacancy for a term that will expire in April of 2013. Applicants must be 18 years of age and a resident of the Village of Reedsville. Please apply, in writing, by stating your reasons for desiring the position. Applications will be accepted at the Village Clerk-Treasurer's office or by contacting any Village Board Member.

Notice of Suspension of Voter Registration: If you received a postcard stating your voter registration will be suspended, you need to sign and return the card to the Village Clerk-Treasurer office as soon as possible. Failure to return the postcard will result in having to fill out a new voter registration form.

Cell Phones vs. Land Line Phones: Many people no longer have a land line (Frontier) phone in their homes. Cell phones are used in place of regular phones. If this is the case, please call the Village-Clerk's office at 754-4371 and let us know your phone number. In case of an emergency, such as a water main break where we may have to turn off your water, we need to get in touch with you. If we do not have updated phone numbers, we cannot reach you and that could be a problem. Even if you have a land line phone and a cell phone, it would be helpful to have both phone numbers on file. Thank you.

Consumer Confidence Report: Copies of the Consumer Confidence Report, water/sewer rate sheet, direct deposit sheet, refuse collection sheet <u>and the June water bill</u> were mailed to all utility customers in a small manila envelope at the end of June. If you have any questions, concerns or need additional copies of any of these sheets, please stop in the Clerk-Treasurer office during normal business hours.

Reminder – Pool Owners: You must fill out the <u>Swimming Pool Discount Application</u> to qualify for the swimming pool discount. No other form of submittal will be accepted. This form can be picked up at the Reedsville Municipal Building Lobby.

Open Burning/Fire Pits: All fires must be monitored by a responsible person until the fire has extinguished itself completely. Only clean wood may be used in fire pits and flames cannot extend more than two feet (2') above the pit. Controlled burning must be located off the public street pavement or street gutter, must be as least fifteen (15') from any lot line and may not be less than fifteen feet (15') from any building. Persons utilizing and maintaining outdoor fires shall be responsible for any liability resulting from any damage caused by their fire.

Curfew: Any person under the age of 18 unaccompanied by a parent or legal guardian may not be out and about between 11:00 pm-6:00 am Sunday through Thursday and 12:00 am-6:00 am, Friday and Saturday.

Bicycle Registration: All bicycles must be registered. To obtain the license, flag down a Village Police Officer. A \$2.00 fee covers a one-time registration.

Defecation on Private or Public Property: It shall be unlawful for any person owning or in control of a dog or cat to allow or permit such animal to defecate on any private or public property owned by another person. Violation of this shall be punishable by a forfeiture of anywhere from \$20.00 to \$200.00

Last installment of your real estate taxes: The Manitowoc County Treasurer, Cheryl M. Duchow, is reminding taxpayers that July 31st is just around the corner and this means the last installment of your real estate taxes is due. Contact the Manitowoc County Treasurer's Office or go to the County website at <u>www.manitowoc-county.com</u> if you are unsure of the amount of taxes due. Along with your check, please mail in the 2nd installment tax stub with your payment to assure that your payment is applied to the correct parcel. Make certain that your payment is postmarked by July 31st. Please include a self-addressed, stamped envelope when requesting a receipt.

Enjoy the sun, but be safe, too

Summer fun for families often revolves around outdoor activities at picnics, playgrounds and pools. Everyone knows that the sun can be dangerous. Excessive exposure to the sun and its harmful ultraviolet rays can cause premature aging of the skin and skin cancer.

According to the American Academy of Dermatology, children are especially at risk for the damaging effects of sun exposure. Even incurring one or two blistering sunburns can significantly increase a child's risk for developing skin cancer later in life.

Studies show that children under 16 are most vulnerable to skin damage. Young people accumulate somewhere between 50% and 80% of their lifetime sun exposure before their 16^{th} birthday.

We should all seek the shade, especially between 10 a.m. and 2 p.m. when the sun is most intense. Using a sunscreen with SPF 15 is a minimum recommendation. If you have fair skin, light-colored eyes and hair, freckles, or spends a lot of time outside, consider using SPF 30 or higher.

Sunscreens should be applied generously 30 minutes before going out in the sun. Use one that blocks both ultraviolet A and B (UVA and UVB) radiation.

Even if the label says "waterproof," sunscreens need to be reapplied every two to three hours. If you're spending the day at the beach or

pool, be sure to reapply sunscreen after swimming.

So enjoy the sun this summer, but be safe, too!
