Mark's journey began January 5th when he could not catch his breath. We went to Holy Family ER where he was diagnosed with a blot clot in his lung. They quickly transported him to Theda Clark for treatment. There things went from bad to worse. Mark was soon put on a ventilator due to strep pneumonia and was in complete respiratory failure. A few days later his kidneys shut down and dialysis was started. Sepsis, an infection throughout his whole body, then set in. Now he was in full multi-system failure and chances of survival were very slim. Although he had gone through many procedures, tests and more tests, he kept getting worse. He slipped into a coma and had a fever of 106 degrees for several days. Then they asked the us the unimaginable...to stop treatment and keep him on comfort measures only. As a family, Mom, Mari, Mike and I with the help of Lisa Peters fought to keep going to see if he could fight through one more hour, one more day. On Friday the 13th of February his fever broke and he woke up. Each day after that found him slowly fighting his way back to us. After eight weeks in the ICU he was upgraded to "serious but stable" and transferred to an acute care facility in West Allis. He spent 10 weeks there to be weaned off the ventilator and for major wound care. Now he has been moved to a subacute care center in Neenah. Here he will have intensive physical therapy and wound care. We have no doubt that Mark will be up and around and on his way back home soon. We continue to pray and stay positive as this is what has gotten Mark and all of us through. Thank you for your continued prayers - Maureen Glasow

Notes From the Village Hall

Street Closed: Green Meadow Drive, from Park Street to the west 55 yards will be closed Saturday, June 20, 2009 from 3:00 pm until Midnight for the Reedsville Flames Youth Football Program Street Party.

Street Closed: Park Street 150 feet south of Manitowoc Street until 150 feet north of Green Meadow Drive will be closed Friday, June 26, 2009 until Sunday, June 28, 2009 for the annual Fire Fighters picnic.

Grass clipping are <u>not</u> to be blown on Village Streets or put into the Creek. Yard waste such as grass clippings, leaves, and yard & garden waste shall be disposed of by composting the material or taking it to the Village compost site.

Operator Licenses: All Operator Licenses expired at midnight on June 30, 2009. If you like to renew your license, please stop at the Village Clerk-Treasurer office during normal business hours to obtain the application. Cost of the license is \$10.00.

Chipping will done the 1st & 3rd Tuesday in the months of April thru October. Clean woody vegetative material no greater than six inches (6") in diameter, and not less than four feet (4') in length can be shredded. Lumber (treated and untreated), skids, and other construction and demolition waste can not be shredded. Place near curb with cut ends facing street. If you are interested in these wood chips, the pile is located near the compost area.

New test offered at Aurora Health Center for patients on blood thinners

Aurora Health Center in Reedsville now offers an easy method of testing using a finger stick for patients on blood-thinning medications.

Patients who take blood thinners such as Coumadin, also known as Warfarin in its generic name, need to be closely monitored with a regular blood test. These medications are used when patients have blood that is too thick, which increases the risk for blood clots and strokes, and thins the blood.

The blood test called Protime, which stands for Prothrombin time, measures the time it takes for the plasma of your blood to clot. Protime checks for low levels of clotting in the blood, low levels of Vitamin K, liver function, abnormal bleeding and measures the effectiveness of the blood thinning medication.

We are offering this service at the request of patients who wished to have this method of testing available close to home for comfort and convenience. Results will continue to be sent to your primary care provider as usual.
