#### BREAK FREE: NATURAL TOOLS FOR OVERCOMING ADDICTIONS **ALCOHOL**

While a moderate amount of alcohol (such as a glass of wine with a meal) doesn't seem to cause serious health problems, excessive alcohol consumption does. Over-consumption of alcohol damages the liver and brain, destroys relationships and can be a factor in traffic accidents. If you are trying to break an addiction to alcohol, you should know that alcohol is converted into sugar in the bloodstream. Thus, it acts very much like a refined carbohydrate. Alcohol is also dehydrating. In fact, most of the effects of a "hangover" are due to low blood sugar and dehydration. So, the first steps to naturally losing the cravings for alcohol are to get properly hydrated and to regulate blood sugar levels. Try drinking two glasses of water everytime you want to drink alcohol and taking supplements that regulate blood sugar levels such as Super Algae and Licorice Root. An excellent formula to aid the recovering alcoholic is Kudzu/St. John's Wort. Studies have shown that it can help control cravings for alcohol. Beer is the most commonly consumed alcoholic beverage. Hops, which is used to make beer, can be taken to reduce cravings for beer, and it provides a similar relaxing effect without the negative problems associated with alcohol. Since the liver works overtime to neutralize alcohol in the blood, excessive consumption of alcohol damages the liver. Milk Thistle can be helpful in healing the liver.
