NOUNCES DRIVE TO IMPROVE BU-
BOLZ MEMORIAL PARK PLAY-
GROUND AND ADD DOG PARK**

Reedsville area children—and pets—will be happy to hear about a new initiative launched by the Reedsville Economic Development Committee. According to Honorary Chairperson Heidi Bubolz, "We're in the process of obtaining funds to update playground equipment at Bubolz Memorial Park which will include the addition of a module for special needs children. The playground receives a great deal of use especially during the summer baseball season when players and fans bring their families. The older equipment has been removed, and we are going to replace it with more durable units that are geared to promoting physical fitness and that give us the opportunity to add more features at a later date.

"We also plan to use the open area around the park to create a small dog park that we're calling the Reedsville 'Park & Bark.' It will include a fenced-in area for owners to exercise their pets, as well as a covered shelter, picnic bench, and waste disposal facility.

"The dog park will include a special memorial walk incorporating inscribed bricks that will enable people to honor present and deceased pets. Donations will cover the cost of the bricks and their installation, as well as a contribution to the development of the park and playground. Because exercise is important to both children and animals, we think it's a good idea all around."

The fund drive will include collections through donation jars prepared by the local Boy Scout troop, special events including a blessing of the pets, participation in the annual Reedsville Firemen's Parade, and other fundraising efforts. Mrs. Bubolz comments, "We're extremely excited at this opportunity to improve facilities that will be open to people and pets throughout Reedsville and the surrounding areas. We invite participation by individuals, businesses, and local foundations."

Located north of Highway 10 in Reedsville, Bubolz Memorial Park was made possible through a donation of land by the Bubolz family. It includes a baseball field, Concession Stand and a playground, as well as the open acreage that will be used for the dog park.

**PUBLIC NOTICE

The Reedsville Fire Department wants to inform you on policies that will assist you in the event of severe weather.

In the event of severe weather the Manitowoc County Emergency Management will activate the siren located in the Village of Reedsville using the following guidelines:

Severe Thunderstorm Watch

- The siren **DOES NOT** tone.

Severe Thunderstorm Warning

- The siren **DOES NOT** tone.

Tornado Watch

- The siren **DOES NOT** tone.

Tornado Warning

- The siren will tone for three (3) minutes.
- The Fire Department will also send its emergency vehicles throughout the fire district to warn residents.
- You should tune to local TV & Radio for further updates.
- The siren may go off multiple times depending on storm status. This means that danger is still present.
- There is no "All Clear" siren tone.
- The Reedsville Village Hall will be opened up as an emergency shelter for those that need it.

However, during inclement weather, everyone is encouraged to remain alert and listen to weather reports via the television and/or radio. Reminder: Don't forget batteries, in the event of a power failure.

Childhood Diabetes

Childhood diabetes is a growing problem.

There are two types of diabetes that are impacting children of all ages; type 1 and type 2 diabetes.

In type 1 diabetes, the pancreas no longer produces insulin. The most telling sign of this disease in a child's body is the abrupt onset of more frequent drinking and urinating for at least two to four weeks. Other typical symptoms include wetting the bed and unexplained weight loss.

One risk factor for type 1 diabetes is family history. Example: A father with type 1 diabetes has approximately a six percent chance of having an affected child, while a diabetic mother has about a one and half percent chance.

Type 1 diabetes is treated by insulin injections.

Simply put, type 2 diabetes is the body's resistance to insulin and is often associated with childhood obesity.

Type 2 is related much more to genetics. A child has a 50 percent risk of developing type 2 if a sibling has it. It can show up without symptoms. Type 2 diabetes is treated with diet and oral medications to break down insulin resistance and allow naturally produced insulin to work better.

Type 2 diabetes used to be an adult disease, but today we are seeing it more in pediatrics. To help your children stay on track and avoid the potential onset of type 2 diabetes, it is important to promote physical activity and healthful eating.

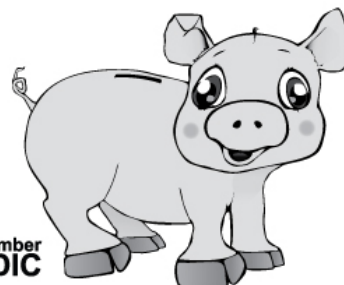

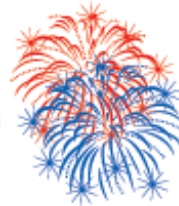

A motion was made by Lorrigan and seconded by Olson to have Village employees cut the Reedsville Athletic Assn field for \$1,100.00 a year and to have Jerry Maertz cut the Village Cemetery for \$350.00 a year. Motion carried 5-0.

Hills presented the First Responders monthly report. Correspondence was presented from Aaron Barr resigning from the Reedsville First Responders. A motion was made by Campana and seconded by Reis to accept the resignation.

Mignon presented the Police Department written monthly report. Busse gave an update on the water breaks and the Lift Station. A motion was made by Olson and seconded by Reis to purchase a new pump from Vacuum, Pump and Compressor Inc. in the amount of \$9,694.00. Motion carried 5-0. Busse presented the Fire Department quarterly call report.

A motion was made by Olson and seconded by Siebert to install fence to match the bridge railing on the school side of the creek. Motion carried 5-0. A motion was made by Olson and seconded by Siebert to approve the offer of purchase of the Industrial Park Drive cul-du-sac from United Packaging. Motion carried 5-0. Campana gave an update on the Manitowoc River Watershed meeting he attended. Olson gave an update on the Bubolz Park Playground Equipment Project. The next regular meeting will be held on Thursday, May 1, 2014 at 6:30 PM. A motion was made by Reis and seconded by Olson to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried 5-0. Meeting adjourned at 8:35 PM.
