Let's celebrate Men's Health Month

June is Men's Health Month — a perfect time to increase awareness of preventable health problems and promote early disease detection by encouraging men to receive regular health and wellness screenings.

It is important that men establish themselves with a regular health care provider or primary health care provider (PCP) and have regular exams, even in their 20s and 30s.

A brief list of recommended screening tests for men are listed below. The following guidelines are generalized and a health care provider should be consulted about family history and the potential need for sooner screening:

Prostate cancer screening

The American Cancer Society (ACS) recommends that men have a chance to make an informed decision with their health care provider about whether to be screened for prostate cancer.

The decision should be made after receiving information about the

uncertainties, risks and potential benefits of prostate cancer screening. This discussion should take place at:

- Age 50 for men who are at average risk and are expected to live at least 10 more years.
- Age 45 for men at high risk of developing prostate cancer.
- Age 40 for men at even higher risk (those with more than one first-degree relative who had prostate cancer at an early age).

Colorectal cancer screening

Beginning at age 50, men should talk with their health care provider about their colorectal cancer screening options.

Testicluar cancer

Screening for testicular cancer should take place between the ages of 17 and 34.

Blood pressure screening

Left untreated, high blood pressure increases the risk of heart attack, stroke, heart failure, kidney damage and blindness

Cholesterol screening

This is a simple blood test to measure total cholesterol, low-density lipoprotein (LDL) cholesterol, and high-density lipoprotein (HDL) cholesterol and triglycerides.

While some of these tests may be perceived as being embarrassing or uncomfortable, they can help diagnose or event prevent some very serious diseases and could even save your life.

The monthly meeting of the Reedsville Village Board was called to order on April 2, 2015 at 6:30 PM by Village President Andy Bubolz. The minutes of the previous meeting of March 5, 2015 were approved as presented.

A motion was made by Lorrigan and seconded by Reis to pay the accounts payable in the amount of \$177,967.03. Motion carried 4-0. A motion was made by Siebert and seconded by Campana to approve the Temporary Class B License application from the Reedsville Fire Fighters. Motion carried 4-0. A motion was made by Campana and seconded by Reis to approve the Operator License application from Tara Beyer. Motion carried 4-0. A motion was made by Reis and seconded by Campana to approve the Driveway Cut-out application from Valu-Pro Power Center. Motion carried 4-0. A motion was made by Lorrigan and seconded by Reis to approve Pay Request #4 from Feaker & Sons Co., Inc. in the amount of \$97,202.56. Motion carried 4-0. Correspondence was presented from Outagamie County regarding the recycling rates.

Hills presented the First Responders written report. Mignon presented the Police Dept. monthly report. Busse presented the Utility Dept. written report.

Busse presented the Fire Dept. written report.

A motion was made by Siebert and seconded by Reis to approve the Agreement from Struck & Irwin Paving to slurry seal in the amount of \$11,202.45. Motion carried 4-0. A motion was made by Campana and seconded by Reis to approve the Agreement from Crack Filling in the amount of \$10,300.00. Motion carried 4-0. A discussion was held regarding cutting grass at the Reedsville Athletic Assn field. A motion was made by Campana and seconded by Reis to charge

\$75.00 each time it is cut. Motion carried 4-0. Bubolz will contact the Reedsville Athletic Assn about this and designating an individual as the contact person.

A discussion was held regarding internet services. Mignon will contact Time Warner Cable about their services. Campana introduced Resolution 2015-3 Opposing Elimination of Personal Property Taxes. A motion was made by Reis and seconded by Siebert to approve the Resolution as presented. Motion carried 4-0. A discussion was held regarding installing 100 watt LED lights. A motion was made by Reis and seconded by Campana to have WPS install the new fixtures on the north side of Highway 10 this year at no cost to the Village. Motion carried 4-0.

Schuh informed the Board that the Manitowoc Street Bridge project was awarded to Radtke Contraction in the amount of \$515,467.00. The Park Street Bathroom Remodeling project has been put on hold until the Village hears back from the organizations. A closed session was scheduled for April 8, 2015 at 6:30 pm to discuss an offer for services.

At 7:00 pm a motion was made by Siebert and seconded by Reis to convene into closed session, pursuant to WI Statute Section 19.85(1) (f) to consider data of specific persons. Motion carried 4-0. At 7:02 pm a motion was made by Campana and seconded by Lorrigan to reconvene into open session. Motion carried 4-0.

At 7:28 pm, Bubolz turned the meeting over to Lorrigan to discuss the Deerview Drive Extension Project. Lorrigan turned the meeting back to Bubolz at 7:35 pm.
