# From the Village Hall

<u>Consumer Confidence Report (CCR)</u>: In April, a copy of the 2016 CCR was sent to all Reedsville Utility customers. If you did not receive it or want additional copies, the Report can be picked up at the Reedsville Municipal Building Lobby or found on the Village Website: <u>www.reedsville.org</u> under the Utility Department tab.

<u>Yard Waste</u>: such as grass clippings, leaves, and yard & garden waste shall be disposed of by composting the material or taking it to the Village compost site.

<u>Littering Street Prohibited</u>: No person shall place, throw, deposit, dump, scatter, leave or permit to remain any rubbish, paper, stone, wire, manure, snow, ice, dirt, grass, leaves, construction or yard waste, dirt or filthy substance upon the street, gutter, sidewalk, alley or public ground in the village. Each owner or occupant of any building, dwelling house, store, shop, tenement or structure of any kind and description fronting or abutting on any street, sidewalk, gutter, alley or public ground shall clean the same by sweeping, scraping or shoveling such rubbish, dirt or filth from the sidewalk by or before twelve o'clock (12:00) noon of each day, and shall cooperate with the Public Works Dept. in keeping the streets, alleys, gutters and public grounds in a clean, tidy and orderly manner.


Operator Licenses: All Operator Licenses expire at midnight on June 30, 2017. If you like to renew your license, a fill—in application can be found on the Reedsville Website at <a href="www.reedsville.org">www.reedsville.org</a> under the Forms & Permits tab or picked up at the Reedsville Municipal Building Lobby. NEW: Starting in 2017, you must submit a copy of your driver's license with the application. Cost of the license is \$10.00 (\$17.00 for new Operators)

<u>Pool Owners</u>: You must fill out the <u>Swimming Pool Discount Application</u> to qualify for the swimming pool discount. No other form of submittal will be accepted. 

#### Proceedings of the Reedsville Village Board March 9, 2017

The monthly meeting of the Reedsville Village Board was called to order on March 9, 2017 at 6:30 PM by Village President Andy Bubolz. Present were: Ryan Lorrigan, Jerry Reis, Jack Siebert and Jesse Walt: Also present were: Brad Busse, Melanie Hills, Leroy Krepline, Rob Michaelson, JoAnn Mignon, Nick Ponto, Craig Schuh, John Schuh, and Joe Tisler.

The minutes of the previous meeting of February 9, 2017 were approved as presented.

A motion was made by Reis and seconded by Walt to pay the accounts payable in the amount of \$139,379.20. Motion carried 4-0.

At 7:15 pm a motion was made by Reis and seconded by Walt to convene into closed session, pursuant to WI Statute Section 19.85 (1)(i) to conduct business which requires a closed session to consider matters related to acts by business if discussed in public could adversely affect the business, its employees or former employees. Motion carried 4-0. At 7:30 pm a motion was made by Siebert and seconded by Reis to reconvene into open session. Motion carried 4-0.

Correspondence was presented Manitowoc Public Utilities regarding their billing. A motion was made by Lorrigan and seconded by Siebert to approve the Operator License Applications from Niina Threlfall-Baum, Pamela Zahorik, & Laura Busse. Motion carried 4-0. A motion was made by Lorrigan and seconded by Walt to contact the Village Attorney regarding the new HRA rule. Motion carried 4-0. A motion was made by Lorrigan and seconded by Reis to have Krepline contact the County Highway Commissioner regarding purchasing street salt in the future. Motion carried 4-0.

The First Responders monthly and 2016 annual written reports were presented by M Hills.

The Police Dept. monthly and 2016 annual written reports were presented by Mignon. Mignon read a Letter of Appreciation for the excellent work done by Tisler in regards to the purchase of the Police Truck.

The Fire Dept. verbal monthly report was presented by Busse. A motion was made by Lorrigan and seconded by Siebert to have the physicals required for employment be done at the Aurora Clinic in Valders. Motion carried 4-0.

The Utility Departments monthly written report was presented by Ponto. A motion was made by Reis and seconded by Lorrigan to approve the Agreement with Ayres Associates, Inc for Design, Bidding and Construction Administration Services for painting of the Water Tower in the lump sum amount of \$39,150.00. Motion carried 4-0. Per Public Service Commission correspondence, a motion was made by Reis and seconded by Walt that effective September 1, 2017 property owners will be responsible for ownership as well as maintenance of the sewer lateral from the dwelling to the sewer utility main within the street. Motion carried 4-0. Manitowoc Public Utilities is developing a scope of work for the Manitowoc St Lift Station's repairs and improvements. A motion was made by Lorrigan and seconded by Reis to hire Water Wells Solution to flush and chlorate Well #5 in the amount of \$4,320.00. Motion carried 4-0.

Following a discussion, a motion was made by Reis and seconded by Siebert to get rid of the Jeep. Motion carried 4-0. Prices will be obtained for street patching. A motion was made by Walt and seconded by Reis to have Krepline contact the County Highway Dept regarding putting up a Village sign on Deerview Drive. Motion carried 4-0. A motion was made by Siebert and seconded by Lorrigan to contact Deyo Disposal about setting up a date at the end of April to have a Village Wide Clean-up day. It will be understood that if there is a special charge to dispose of an appliance it will be the responsibility of the owner to pay this fee. Motion carried 3-1 (Reis – nay).

Krahn gave an update on membership to the WI Independent Assessing officers Assn. A motion was made by Siebert and seconded by Lorrigan to renew the USDA Debt Service Certificate of Deposit for 6 months at the Denmark State Bank. Motion carried 4-0. Krahn presented the 2016 Tax Collection Report.
