**Act FAST in case of stroke**

Each year about 795,000 Americans suffer a new or repeat stroke. Stroke is the fourth leading cause of death and the leading cause of disability in this country.

To reduce the incidence of stroke, it's important for all adults to be screened for the primary risk factors — high blood pressure, high cholesterol, diabetes and smoking. It is important to control all of these factors and if you smoke, please take the steps needed to quit.

There are different types of strokes, including "ischemic" strokes, which are the most common. Blood vessels are narrowed or blocked by fatty buildup that forms inside them, or by clots that let loose and travel through the bloodstream. Like a heart attack, when the heart muscle doesn't get enough blood and oxygen, an ischemic stroke is called a "brain attack." Less common is a "hemorrhagic" stroke due to bleeding in the brain.

**Signs of stroke**

Remember the acronym **FAST**:

**F = Face:** Ask the person to smile. Does one side of the face droop?

**A = Arms:** Ask the person to raise both arms. Does one arm drift downward?

**S = Speech:** Ask the person to repeat a simple phrase. Is his or her speech slurred or strange?

**T = Time:** If you observe any of these signs, call 9-1-1 immediately.

If any of these symptoms strike suddenly, you must act FAST. Don't wait.

In stroke cases, "time is brain" and, generally, the sooner clot busting medications are given, the better the outcome when due to a clot.

**Sump Pumps:** No discharge or overflow of storm water shall be permitted upon any street or public way from **October 1 to April 15** of each year.

**Cat & Dog Licenses** are due on or before April 1st. Unspayed females and unneutered males are \$10.00 each. Spayed females and neutered males are \$5.00 each. You must show proof of a valid rabies shot. **Failure to obtain a license by April 1st, will result in a late fee of \$15.00 per pet.**

### GLANDULAR SYSTEM

The glandular (or endocrine) system consists of a group of specialized organs that regulate basic drives and emotions, promote growth, control body temperature, assist in the repair

of broken tissue, and help generate energy.

All glands communicate with each other through chemical messengers called hormones. Hormones coordinate and control the various organs and tissues of the body. The amount of hormone released at any given time depends upon the body's need.

The greater endocrine glands are the pituitary which is the master control gland; secretes growth hormones, the thyroid which secretes hormones to regulate metabolism, the adrenals which secrete adrenaline to prepare the body for action in response to stress conditions, and the parathyroid. Other glands include the pancreas which secretes insulin to regulate blood sugar, and the ovaries in women, and testes in men.

The glandular system functions properly when it has ample stores of minerals, particularly trace minerals. The thyroid, for example, needs ample iodine; the pancreas needs chromium to control blood sugar levels. Zinc seems especially important to the glandular system in men. These are just three examples of the many ways in which nutrition affects glandular function and overall health.

The regular meeting of the Reedsville Board of Education was called to order at 6:33 P.M. by Board –President John Ebert. Present: Board Members – Todd Cavanaugh, Jeff Deprez, John Ebert, and Andrew Maertz. Cory Kiekhaefer – Absent. Administrative Team Members – Dennis Raabe, Tony Butturini, Pat Popp, and Tracie Wurm; Others: Ellen Pierce, Pam Scrivner, Joy Spatchek, Darlene Propson, Mark Propson, Heidi Propson, Briana Propson, Marie Wedepohl, PongTai Danwivat, Sara Lubner, Craig Delleman, Regina Olson, Mike Sabel, Ryan Zunker, Jon Muench, Margaret Reichert, Ted Pierce, Ann Kulas, Christine Shimek, Pam Hammel, Ginni Engstrom, Kim Luedtke, Jerold Korinek, Harry Strothers, Becky O’Leary. Mr. Raabe announced that proper legal notice of the meeting had been given.

I. Opening

- A. The agenda was approved as printed.
- B. Performance by the High School Concert Choir – Directed by Ellen Pierce Choir Members Ellen Hughes, Sarah Joerger, Rachel Reichert, Brianna Propson, Edith Hughes, Morgan Phillips, Eddie Oswald, Hnuchi Yang, Alex Drevs, Austin Stokes, Alexis Schultz, Jada Laurent & Rasha Cummings.
- C. High School Concert Choir led everyone in the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag.
- D. PongTai Danwivat “Em”, an exchange student, spoke about his home town of Bangkok, Thailand and his family.

II. Public Input

Darlene Propson spoke about Mr. Woller’s position. Heidi Propson spoke about Mrs. Hammel’s schedule not having time for additional duties. Jerold Korinek gave the board members a letter regarding cooperative education. Jon Muench & Briana Propson spoke on how much Mr. Woller has done for them. Margaret Reichert spoke that the decision regarding Mr. Woller should be made with more public input. Ted Pierce declined to speak. Andrew Maertz let the parents know that he appreciated the comments from the parents & students. Anyone with further questions can meet one- on-one with Dennis. Dennis Raabe spoke that enrollment has declined 25% over that last 10 years making our student/teacher ratio not as it should be. Our music department is over staffed making this cut necessary for the district.

III. Reports

A. District Administrator

Mr. Dennis Raabe reported as follows: 1. Food Service Hours – these may still change. More information will be provided at the January meeting. 2. School Choice Initiatives – there may be more additional funding available we should watch for more information to be coming on this. Voucher schools are really underperforming more so than was expected. 3 Audit Booklets – the audit does specify 3 diffencies. We don’t have the staff to separate the duties as much as they would like to see. They would like to see year end reporting done by a 3<sup>rd</sup> party. Time and Effort reporting – changes have been made and they are now being completed on time. If there are any questions on the audit, you can speak with Mr. Raabe or Trevor Baya, our accountant. 4. Post retirement benefits.

B. High School Principal

Mr. Tony Butturini reported as follows: 1. Reality Store simulation was held on December 5, 2012. The students were given an occupation with wages and a checkbook, and then sat down with a financial advisor. We will have The Reality Store every two years to give all students an opportunity to go through this experience. 2. The WILL Open House will be moved to December 19, 2012 due to the pending weather. 3. Panther for a Day is coming up on January 9, 2013, this will give the 8<sup>th</sup> graders the opportunity to see what a day in the life of a high schooler is. This will give them a preview

to registration night, which will be held on January 14, 2013. 4. Registration night for Freshman, Sophomores & Juniors will be held on January 21, 2013.

C. Elem/MS Principal

Mr. Pat Popp reported as follows: 1. Tomorrow December 18, 2012 will be the Elementary Winter Program at the Elementary School. 2. They had a very unique birthday over at the Elementary School. She turned 12 on 12/12/12. Mr. Popp took her picture at 12:12.

School Psychologist/Supervisor of Special Education

Dr. Wurm reported as follows: 1. Mishicot has been looking to fill a part-time special ed position since the beginning of the school year. We have had students leave the district leaving us slightly over staffed in this area. With approval, we would be able to share this position allowing us to save the district about \$15,000. 2. WILL Class Open House on December 19, 2012. 3. WKCE tests have been sent off, we are waiting for results. In the future this will be computerized and we will be able to get these results much more timely. 4. We have started receiving checks from the school based services. 5. The next meeting for RTI & PBIS will be on January 16, 2013 and we will also have a pep rally for the students.
