



Precancerous polyps and colorectal cancer don't always cause symptoms. You could have polyps or colorectal cancer and not know it. That's why having a screening test is so important.

Possible symptoms for colorectal cancer include:

- Blood in the stool
- Stomach pain, aches, or cramps that persist
- Unexplained weight loss.

These symptoms may be caused by something other than cancer. If you're having any of these symptoms, the only way to know what is causing them is to see your health care provider.

Following a discussion with Dvorachek, a motion was made by Olson and seconded by Campana to send letters to the businesses located on Industrial Park Drive to invite them to a meeting on February 6, 2014 at 7:00 to discuss the selling of the cul-du-sac property. Motion carried 5-0.

A motion was made by Lorrigan and seconded by Reis to try to sell the Skyline Christmas Decoration by placing an ad in the *"The Municipalty"*. Motion carried 5-0.

Hills gave an update on the number calls for 2013 and the addition of new First Responders.

Busse gave an update on the water break and utility accounts. He also presented correspondence on an insurance letter that has been sent to property owners. The information will be put on the website. A motion was made by Campana and seconded by Olson to purchase a grit dumper and septic receiving strainer from Lee's Contracting/Fabrication inc., in the amount of \$10,901.00. Motion carried 4-0.

Busse presented the Utility Department written monthly report. He also gave an update on the main water break, GIS project and the Dept. of Natural Resources requirements.

Busse presented the Fire Department written monthly report. He also gave an update on the new Fire Truck and appointing Todd Maertz as the new Assistance Chief. Bubolz will contact the Towns about unsigned Fire Protection Agreements.
