Cat & Dog Licenses: The late fee of \$15.00 will be assessed per dog or cat for failure to obtain a license by April 1, 2015. Unspayed females and unneutered males are \$25.00 each. Spayed females and neutered males are \$20.00 each. You must show proof of a valid rabies shot.

Bicycle Registration: All bicycles must be registered. To obtain the license, flag down a Village Police Officer. A \$2.00 fee covers a one-time registration.

Board of Review: The Village of Reedsville will hold its Board of Review on May 12, 2015 from 2:00 pm until 4:00 pm in the hall at the Reedsville Municipal Building located at 217 Menasha Street. Please contact the Clerk-Treasurer at 754-4371 for the procedural requirements if you would like to appear before the Board.

Curfew: Any person under the age of 18 unaccompanied by a parent or legal guardian may not be out and about between 11:00 PM - 6:00 AM Sunday through Thursday and 12:00 PM - 6:00 AM Friday and Saturday.

Vehicle Nuisance: It is illegal for any partially dismantled, non operating, wrecked, junked, unregistered or discarded vehicles to be placed or stored on any public or private property within the Village limits for a period of longer than five (5) days, unless said vehicles are stored within an enclosed building. This ordinance does not apply to property zoned for the sale or repair of vehicles. Having a vehicle behind your garage or under a tarp does not meet the requirement of an enclosed building.

Open Burning/Fire Pits: Controlled burning must be located off the public street pavement or street gutter, must be as least fifteen (15') from any lot line and may not be less than fifteen feet (15') from any building. Only clean wood may be used in fire pits and flames cannot extend more than two feet (2') above the pit. All fires must be monitored by a responsible person until the fire has extinguished itself completely. Persons utilizing and maintaining outdoor fires shall be responsible for any liability resulting from any damage caused by their fire.

Pool Owners: You must fill out the **Swimming Pool Discount Application** to qualify for the swimming pool discount. No other form of submittal will be accepted. This form can be found on the Reedsville website www.reedsville.org or picked up at the Reedsville Municipal Building Lobby.

Dogs Or Cats: It shall be unlawful to own, harbor, shelter, or keep any dog or cat which runs at large within the limits of the Village. A dog or cat shall be deemed to be running at large when it is on any public street, alley, parks, or other grounds of the Village or any other premises in the Village other than the premises of its owner, his servant, agent or a member of his family of suitable age and discretion unless it is on a durable leash no longer than eight feet (8') or the dog or cat must be under control and within eight feet (8') of its owner, his servant, agent or a member of his family of suitable age and discretion at all times when off the premises of its owner.

It shall be unlawful for any person owning or in control of a dog or cat to allow or permit such animal to defecate on any private or public property owned by another unless such person shall remove all feces so deposited by such animal. Violation shall be punishable by a forfeiture of not less than twenty dollars (\$20.00) nor more than two hundred dollars (\$200.00).


Bike Rodeo to be Held


MEMORIAL POPPY



Members of the Gosz/Novak Unit #199 will be wearing a red Memorial Poppy, as a symbol of price of war and the sacrifice of millions, as a sign of their appreciation this Memorial Day weekend. The 900,000 members of the American Legion Auxiliary, the world's largest women's patriotic service organization, are asking everyone to wear a Poppy on Memorial Day weekend. "Wear it in honor of the millions of Americans who have willingly served our nation, all too many of whom made the ultimate sacrifice," said Jane Kalies, Auxiliary President, of the Gosz/Novak Unit #199 Reedsville. The Poppy also honors Wisconsin's disabled veterans at the Zablocki VA Medical Center in Milwaukee who make the red crepe paper Poppy. Stroke is the fourth leading cause of death and a leading cause of disability in this country. Someone in the U.S. has a stroke about once every 40 seconds, killing nearly 129,000 people annually. To reduce the chance of stroke, all adults should be screened for the primary risk factors — high blood pressure, high cholesterol, diabetes and smoking. If you smoke, please take the steps needed to quit. There are different types of strokes. Strokes due to lack of blood to the brain are the most common. Blood vessels are narrowed or blocked by fatty plaque or by clots that form and block blood flow to the brain. This kind of stroke is called a "brain attack" because

Signs of stroke

Remember the acronym FAST:

F = Face: Ask the person to smile. Does one side of the face droop? A = Arms: Ask the person to raise both arms. Does one arm drift downward? S = Speech: Ask the person to repeat a simple phrase. Is his or her speech slurred or strange? T = Time: If you observe any of these signs, call 9-1-1 immediately.

If any of these symptoms strike suddenly, you must act FAST. Don't wait. In stroke cases, "time is brain" and the sooner newer clot busting medications are given, generally, the better the outcome.
