

From the Village Hall

Winter Parking Restrictions: No person shall park any vehicle on any street or alley in the Village between two-thirty (2:30) AM to six (6) AM of any day from November 1 to April 1, unless permission to do so is received from the Police Department. YOU MUST OBTAIN PERMISSION EACH YEAR, so if you had permission for last winter (2009/2010), you must obtain permission for this winter (2010/2011).

Even with permission, vehicles may not be parked on any street or alley when we receive snow. Lack of vehicles on streets and alleys allow the Village employees to clean up in a more timely fashion. If you have question on this, please contact the Reedsville Police Dept at 754-4757.

Refuse/Recyclable Pick-up: Due to the Thanksgiving holiday, refuse and recyclables will be picked up on Saturday, November 27, 2010.

Clerk/Treasurer's office will be closed November 22nd thru November 26th, 2010.

General Election: There will be a General Election on Tuesday, November 2nd for Governor/Lieutenant Governor, Attorney General, Secretary of State, State Treasurer, United State Senator, Representative in Congress, State Senator, Representative to the Assembly, County Sheriff, County Coroner, County Clerk of Circuit Court and a County Referendum. Polls will be open at the Reedsville Municipal Building, 217 Menasha St., from 7:00 am until 8:00 pm

Voter Registration Information: If you have not registered and would like to vote November 4th you need to bring your Drivers License with you to the polling place. The federal Help America Vote Act of 2002 (HAVA) and Wisconsin State Statutes require all voters in Wisconsin to be registered in order to vote after January 1, 2006.

Use Permits for ATV & Golf Carts will expire December 31st. To obtain a new permit you must show proof of insurance and pay the \$20.00 fee. The 2011/2012 permits can be purchased at Jim's Service & Car Wash, 305 Manitowoc St.

Village Ordinance Reminders

2-2-3-4 States no discharge or overflow of storm water shall be permitted upon any public street of public way from October 1 to April 15 of each year.

9-1-8 No person shall park any vehicle on any street or alley in the Village between the hours of 2:30 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. of any day from November 1st to April 1st, unless permission to do so is received from the police department. As always should you need an overnight exception due to visitors or special circumstances please contact our office for permission prior to leaving any vehicle on the road way and we will attempt to work together to resolve your need. 

Standing up to Osteoporosis

In recent years more attention has been paid to osteoporosis and for good reason. This disease is a serious health problem resulting in more than 1.5 million fractures of the back, wrists and hips annually.

Bone loss usually occurs over time, without any symptoms. The amount of bone mass you have accumulated as a young adult and the rate at which you lose it as you age determine your risk for developing osteoporosis. The disease is more common in:

- women, especially those past menopause;
- women who go through menopause early (before 45);
- people with a thin or small frame;
- anyone with a history of low-trauma fractures as an adult:
- people with an inflammatory form of arthritis;
- those with a family history of osteoporosis;
- people who eat few calcium-rich foods, such as dairy foods;
- smokers and those who drink more than one or two alcoholic beverages a day;
 - those of European and Asian ancestry;
 - people who don't exercise regularly; and
 - men with low levels of testosterone.

If you are at risk for developing this disease, ask your health care provider if you need a bone density test. This test is a fast, safe, and painless way to find out the status of a person's bone structure. Also, all women, age 65 and older and men 75 and older should get this test done regardless of risk factors.

It's important to diagnose osteoporosis as early as possible, so that treatment can begin immediately.
