

A TRIBUTE TO OUR VOLUNTEERS

We have student volunteers that come out during the school year on specific days for 1-3 hours. This is done through the school system and has been very helpful. Last school year we had Julia Joerger and Shawn Schwoerer from the Reedsville School District. And during the summer months we had Marsha & Jason Schwoerer. Hannah Sorenson from Reedsville volunteered at Sunrise as part of her work study in the spring of 2011. Two Rivers High School has had 2-4 students coming out during the past school years for two afternoons a week. They, also have been working on a project to replace some doors

This summer we had a schoolteacher from the Kaukauna School District, Cathy Wilda. She volunteered to work with the students one morning or one afternoon each week. We also had Kaitlin Cleven from the Greenleaf area as a volunteer 1-2 times per week. Kaitlin is a student in college and her future will be involved in equine therapy.

Some of the projects the volunteers were involved in are throwing down hay and stacking it, mucking out the manure, sweeping the floors, feeding and grooming the horses, cleaning water tanks, pulling weeds, transplanting flowers, cleaning the old granary and moving the tack into it.

This past spring and summer we had a group of people doing a weekend project here at Sunrise. They were from the Madison's Master's Commission, Cornerstone Community Church in Manitowoc and a youth group from Crossroad's Church in Sheboygan. Their projects consisted of pressure washing the mats and floors in the barn, organizing the fencing supplies, landscaping an area, painting the shed. The Madden Family from Cleveland have been volunteering here as a family since January. They are here every Saturday morning to do chores and then to ride Amber if that works into their schedule. Sunrise Horse Farm also had teenagers that needed to do community service hours through the court system for restitution. Hours were varied from cutting lawn, weed-whacking along the fence lines to organizing lumber for other future

projects. Kassi Brunner and Val Gengler are new volunteers to Sunrise Horse Farm and are helping with the chores. They were on horseback doing "traffic control" on our road for the Summer Gallop. Angie Schambureck is a volunteer that has been with Sunrise for a few years. While she was unemployed she was able to be here during the day and was a wonderful mentor to the students. Now that she is back at work she still comes twice a week to do chores and is working on a project of doing something special in the old milk house. Brenda Witak and her children have been volunteers here for a few years, also. She and Angie both have a love for horses that is very evident. My daughter, Becky LeBoeuf, is always doing countless tasks to help in whatever area she can. One day we had two autistic boys ages 3 & 4 and with her help the boys had a wonderful time.

We have a retired carpenter from Whitelaw, Jim Kohlbeck, who is working on various projects with a student from Lincoln High School. It warms my heart to see these teenagers learning new skills from someone such as Jim. Some of the students that come here or volunteer do not want to be with the horses and that is fine for there are other things to do.

We do not just work, we have fun, we take breaks. On hot days it may be splashing water at one another out of the water tank, on cold days we may be in the house having hot apple cider and warming up. Or we maybe decorating the barn for Christmas and making cards for the soldiers in Iraq.

So as you can see, Sunrise Horse Farm is a place for different volunteers to put their talents to work. The program here at Sunrise teaches responsibility, a good work ethic and is a place to learn life skills - all with the pleasure of being around the horses.
