

Time to get your cholesterol checked?

Did you know that cholesterol is needed to keep our bodies healthy? However, excess cholesterol can stick to the walls of vessels, making it harder for blood to move through.

HDL is the GOOD cholesterol. HDL stands for "high density lipoproteins." HDL can help slow the buildup of plaque and protect against heart disease.

LDL is the BAD cholesterol. LDL stands for "low density lipoproteins." This type of cholesterol can stick to the inner walls of arteries and form plaque. Plaque can plug up the arteries and cause clots, strokes, heart disease and heart attacks.

Cholesterol is measured with a blood test. The test reports TOTAL cholesterol, along with the breakdown of the amount of each type of cholesterol. Optimal cholesterol levels for healthy persons are:

Total cholesterol: Less than 200 mg/dL HDL (good): at least 40mg/dL for men and 50 mg/dL for women.

LDL (bad): Less than 100 mg/dL. The lower your LDL, the lower your risk for heart disease and stroke.

Triglycerides (another fat in the blood that raises cholesterol): Less than 150 mg/dL

What can you do to maintain a healthy cholesterol level? Eat a heart-healthy diet. Maintain a healthy weight and exercise regularly. Avoid tobacco smoke.

Your health care provider may prescribe cholesterollowering medication, if lifestyle

changes aren't enough. So please be heart smart — get your cholesterol levels checked!
