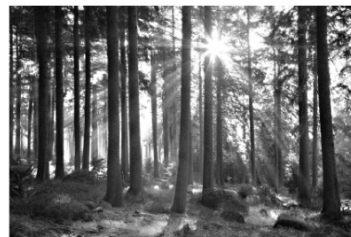

VITAMIN B7 (BIOTIN)

Understanding the role of the nurse practitioner

A nurse practitioner (NP) is a registered nurse (RN) with a masters or doctoral degree in nursing with additional clinical training in a health care specialty area such as family practice or adult medicine. After completing the college educational requirements, the NP registers to become licensed by the state as an APRN (Advanced Practice Registered Nurse). We must take a certification exam and become Board Certified in our specialty. We then can take the Prescriptive Authority Exam to have the ability to prescribe medication independently. Some states have different rules regarding what Nurse Practitioners can do.

- Nurse practitioners are able to:
- obtain a medical history and perform a physical exam
 - diagnose and treat acute and chronic illnesses and injuries
 - order, perform and interpret diagnostic tests, such as lab work and x-rays
 - prescribe medications and other treatments
 - counsel patients on preventative health and lifestyle practices
 - educate patients on self-care skills and treatment options
 - perform procedures and therapies per our education

Nurse practitioners are trained to provide primary, acute or specialty health care in collaboration with a physician with whom they maintain a close working relationship with.

Nurse practitioners can safely perform many of the same functions as a physician, and know when to consult with other medical professionals



when the patient's problem is beyond the NPs scope of care.
