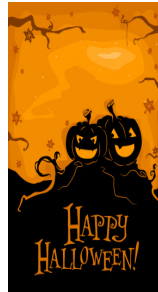

# From the Village Hall

**Thank You!** On the behalf of the citizens of the Village and the Village Board, I would like to say thank you to TOPS 1562 for planting and maintaining the flowers in front of the Reedsville Municipal Building. Your contribution is greatly appreciated.

**Garbage, Rubbish and Recyclables From Outside of Municipality:** It shall be unlawful for any persons to place, deposit or cause to be deposited for collection, any garbage, rubbish or recyclable materials from outside the boundary limits of Reedsville into the Village unless authorized by an agreement with the Village.

**Improper Use of Garbage, Rubbish or Recycling Receptacles:** It shall be unlawful for any persons to place, deposit or cause to be deposited in or on any receptacle, or compost area not belonging to or assigned by the owner without the permission of the owner or designated assignee unless such receptacle or areas is designed expressly or implicitly for use by the general public.

**Compost:** Yard waste such as grass clippings, leaves, and yard & garden waste shall be disposed of by composting the material or leaving it at the Village compost site. Items NOT to be put in the compost are: stumps, roots, shrubs with intact root balls, animal waste, pine cones and sod.

**Defecation on Private or Public Property:** It shall be unlawful for any person owning or in control of a dog or cat to allow or permit such animal to defecate on any private or public property owned by another person. Violation of this shall be punishable by a forfeiture of anywhere from \$20.00 to \$200.00

**Sump Pumps:** No discharge or overflow of storm water shall be permitted upon any street or public way from **October 1** to April 1 of each year.

**Trick or Treat Hours:** The Village of Reedsville will hold Trick or Treat on Sunday, October 30, 2016 from 2:00 PM to 4:00 PM.

**Chipping Dates:** October 4<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup>. October 18<sup>th</sup> will be the last date until April 2017.

**Recycling Pick-Up:** October 7<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup>.

## What are the requirements to register or update a registration?

1. In Wisconsin you have to be at least 18 years old on or before the NEXT election. The next state-wide election is November 8, 2016, so anyone who is now 17 and has a birthday on or before November 8, 2016, can register now if they meet the rest of the requirements.
2. You must be a U.S. Citizen, not currently serving a felony conviction (either jail time or probation), nor been declared incompetent or ineligible to vote by a judge.
3. You must have resided in your home for at least 10 days prior to Election Day in order to establish a new voting location.
4. You must show Proof of Residency: an acceptable document that proves you reside (live) where you say you reside. The most commonly used acceptable documents include: a current and valid driver's license or state ID issued by the Wisconsin DMV, a recent utility bill (gas, electric, phone, TV cable or satellite, or internet – not credit card), a paycheck or pay stub, and a bank or credit union statement. The utility bill, paycheck, paystub, or banking statement can be shown either as a paper document or in electronic format.

### Proceedings of the Reedsville Village Board

**July 14, 2016**

The monthly meeting of the Reedsville Village Board was called to order on July 14, 2016 at 6:30 PM by Village President Andy Bubolz. Present were: Ryan Lorrigan, Jerry Reis, Jack Siebert and Jesse Walt: Also present were: Brad Busse, Melanie Hills, Leroy Krepline, JoAnn Mignon, Nick Ponto, Joe Tisler, Yvonne Deyo, Steve Webster, and Mr. & Mrs. Paul Denor

The minutes of the previous meeting of June 13, 2016 were approved as presented.

A motion was made by Siebert and seconded by Reis to pay the accounts payable in the amount of \$85,345.78. Motion carried 4-0. The First Responders monthly written report was presented by Hills.

The Police Dept. monthly verbal report was presented by Mignon. Bubolz turned the meeting over to Lorrigan at 6:48 pm to discuss regulation of other animals within the Village limits. Ordinance 2016-5 regarding the regulations was introduced by Reis. A motion was made by Siebert and seconded by Walt to approve the Ordinance as presented. Roll call taken; motion carried 4-0. Lorrigan turned the meeting back to Bubolz at 6:51 pm

The Utility Departments monthly written report was presented by Ponto.

The Fire Dept. monthly verbal report was presented by Busse. Busse expressed a concern about the wiring at the Firemen's Park.

A motion was made by Lorrigan and seconded by Reis to approve the Polyurethane Option from Raise Rite for cement repairs in the amount of \$1,235.00. Motion carried 4-0. A discussion was held regarding a Village wide clean-up day. Krahn will obtain more information on this. A motion was made by Siebert and seconded by Reis to approve the request from Webster regarding the closing of 3rd Street from Menasha Street south to Manitowoc Street from 3:00 pm to Midnight on August 5th & 6th, 2016. Motion carried 4-0. A motion was made by Lorrigan and seconded by Walt to obtain proposals for the replacement of water and sewer lines on 5th street from Manitowoc Street south to Monroe Street. Proposals will be due by 3:00 pm on August 10th, 2016. Motion carried 4-0. Upon reviewing the proposals, a motion was made by Lorrigan and seconded by Reis to approve the proposal from Tennesen Appraisals LLC for the 2017 and 2018 assessment years in the amount of \$3,000.00 a year. Motion carried 4-0. A motion was

made by Siebert and seconded by Walt to invest the CWF Replacement funds into a Utility Replacement Money Market fund and the fund can only be used for Utility Replacement items. The CWF Bond & Interest funds will be deposited into the Utility saving account for operating expenses. Motion carried 4-0. A motion was made by Lorrigan and seconded by Siebert to approve the Temporary Class B Beer License Application from Holy Family Parish. Motion carried 4-0.
