Friends of St. Patrick, Inc.

The Friends of St. Patrick, Inc. are busily planning a 20th anniversary celebration of the first "COME HOME TO MAPLE GROVE" CELEBRATION IN 1992.

The historic Maple Grove community will host the celebration on Sunday, September 9, at the St. Patrick Historic Building (the former St. Patrick church) grounds and Heritage Park at the corner of Hwy G and Taus Road Maple Grove.

This Manitowoc county Irish settlement began in 1848 and grew to over 200 families by 1865. At one time in the 19th century the community numbered over 2500 people who traveled to the Irish parish of St. Patrick's for Mass, weddings, funerals, and other important religious and family occasions.

The planning committee has a full day planned for those attending this event.

Prior to an outdoor Mass, beginning at 10:00am, an Irish Harpist, Cheryl Murphy will be performing in the Historic Building. The Mass offered by Fr. Kevin Ori, will begin at 10:30 and will feature guest soloist, David Logan from Pelhan Manor in New York City, NY. Logan is a descendent of Peter and Jesse Logan who settled in the area as a farmer and blacksmith in the 1860's. The St. Michael's church choir, Whitelaw, under the direction of Dan Rabideau will sing, accompanied by Kate Stodola.

Following the Mass, a tribute will be given to Miki (Hoffman) Gould, who was instrumental in organizing the Friends of St. Patrick and doing a tremendous amount of genealogical work for the Irish community of Maple Grove. Irish Entertainers will be following: Bagpiper Peter McGinty, singer Bill Clancy, Celtic Consort Michael Murphy, Singers & Fiddlers The Hussey Family, Singer Erin Fenlon, and The Irish Dancers. Irish stew, brats, hamburgers & grilled cheese, plus many different refreshments will be available. Besides kolache making and sale, a large bake sale will be offered in the Sisters kitchen (the old convent House). Adult and Kids games and genealogy help will be available in the Historic Building, as well as a large silent auction. Well know artist, Bob Kellner of Manitowoc will be on the grounds throughout the day showing his works and producing more of his Maple Grove pieces.

Bus trips to view ancestral farms and homes in the area, with a stop at the O'Hearn Irish Dairy Farm, is being planned. St. Patrick Cemetery tours will feature 17 individuals reenacting early settlers who are buried in St. Patrick cemetery.

A raffle with \$1000 pay out will be awarded at 4:30 pm. Raffle tickets will be available for sale on the grounds the day of the celebration.

Make the most of your medical appointment

Today, most patients are more informed and actively involved in their medical care. Here are some tips to ensure you get the most out of your next medical visit:

- When you call for your appointment, tell us all the issues you need to discuss. This will allow us to schedule enough time to discuss the issues.
- Bring an updated list of the drugs you are currently taking, including over-the-counter drugs and supplements. Have questions written out so if you're nervous, you can remember what you wanted to ask.
- The nurse should always tell you what is being given and what it's for. If you don't recognize a medication or have questions, please speak up.
- If you are given new prescriptions upon discharge, be sure to fill them right away and start taking your medications as directed. Having all of your prescriptions filled at the same pharmacy will help avoid adverse drug interactions.
- Understand your diagnosis. You should be clear on what the plan of care is for you. There may not always be a known diagnosis at the end of your appointment and more testing may be required. If you are not clear on what you are to do, please ask.
- The easiest way to prevent infection is to insist that everyone washes his or her hands before touching you. If you don't see people doing that in front of you, politely ask if they have.
- If something you see bothers you or gives you a sense that something is not guite right, speak up.
- Do your part in caring for yourself as well. Follow the plan. If you're having a problem with a new medication when you get home, don't just stop the medicine, call or visit your health care provider to discuss the problem.

Following these tips will help you make the most out of your next medical appointment.

Proceedings of the Reedsville Village Board

July 16, 2012

A meeting of the Reedsville Village Board was called to order on July 16, 2012 at 6:30 PM by Village President Ritalyn Schuh. Present were: Andy Bubolz, Bob Campana, Mary Olson, Marybeth Rabideau, Jerry Reis, and Jack Siebert. Also present were: Brad Busse, Craig Schuh, and Joe Tisler.

The minutes of the previous meeting of July 2, 2012 were approved as corrected.

A motion was made by Olson and seconded by Campana to pay the accounts payable in the amount of \$22,222.32. Motion carried 6-0.

President Report: None

Committee Reports: Fire Dept – Written Report

Park & Recreation: The park lighting discussion was postponed until more information can be obtained. A motion was made by Olson and seconded by Siebert to allow the Reedsville News to go up to 6 pages where it would increase the cost to \$410.00. Motion carried 6-0. Cost will be obtained from other municipalities to see what they charge for advertising in their newsletters. A motion was made by Rabideau and seconded by Olson to allow Holy Family Parish to put up a sign for their picnic on the corner of Hwy 10 and W. Motion carried 6-0. A motion was made by Olson and seconded by Rabideau to allow a sign to go up on the corner of Hwy 10 and W advertising the Wizard of Oz play. Motion carried 6-0.

Public Works: The discussion on the Deerview Drive Extension project was postponed until the Board has time to review the cost estimate. The discussion on the street light installation request was postponed until WPS can provide costs. Schuh gave an update on the progress of the creek dredging application.

Public Utilities: Written Report. A motion was made by Reis and seconded by Campana to choose Option 2 (Prepay) on the Fixed Price Propane Contract with the Country Vision Coop in the amount of \$2,998.76. Motion carried 6-0. A meeting was scheduled for July 27th to work on the disconnection policy.

General Government: A motion was made by Olson and seconded by Campana to approve the Temporary Class B License application from Holy Family Parish. Motion carried 6-0. A motion was made by Bubolz and seconded by Siebert to approve the Soda License application from Holy Family Parish. Motion carried 6-0. A motion was made by Olson and seconded by Reis to approve the Operator License applications from Tom O'Connell, John Sloma, Jon Kees, Stacy Schanilec and Maureen Glasow. Motion carried 6-0. Correspondence was presented from Wondrous Webs regarding options for putting Village forms on the website. A motion was made by Campana and seconded by Rabideau to choice the option to make them editable online but they would need to print them off and return them. Motion carried 6-0.

Personnel: A motion was made by Siebert and seconded by Olson to have David Boettcher teach Kiekhaefer welding. Board approved 5 sessions and cost will be determined by how many hours are involved.

The next regular meeting will be held on August 6, 2012 at 6:30 PM. A motion was made by Reis and seconded by Campana to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried 6-0. Meeting adjourned at 7:54 PM.
