



The Park Street Lift Station base elbow replacement project has been completed. The Public Works Dept monthly written report was presented by J Schuh. C Schuh explained he is waiting for the USDA to contact him about setting up a meeting. Siebert will obtain prices for the donation sign and will contact Lorrigan about installing the score board. Walt will contact the Reedsville Athletic Assn about the lawn cutting of the softball field. Krahn informed the Board letters were sent out to residents involved in the Menasha Street slurry seal project.
