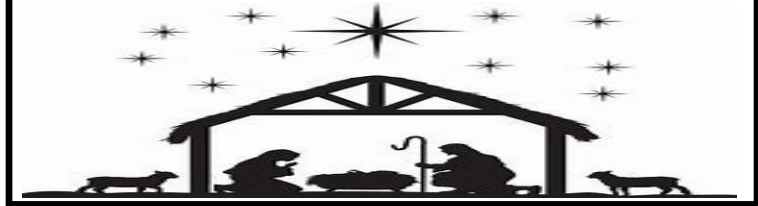

**Village Board Meeting Minutes
September 12, 2019**

The monthly meeting of the Reedsville Village Board was called to order on September 12, 2019, at 5:30 PM by Village President Jesse Walt. Present were: Becky Busse, Jennifer Maertz, Chad Rataichek, Patty Schreiber and Jack Siebert. Absent: Terry Hansen. Also present were: Brad Busse, Tony Depies, Michelle Foytik, Justin Meyer, JoAnn Mignon, Craig Schuh, John Schuh Debbie Karl, Sonia Collins, LeRoy and Barb Krepline, Cindy Carter, and Eric Duenkel.

A motion was made by Schreiber and seconded by Siebert to approve the agenda as presented. Motion carried 6-0.

Walt opened the Public Informational Meeting for the USDA projects. (see attached sheets for attendance). Ayres gave a presentation on the scope of the project. Items discussed were narrowing the streets, curb & gutters, storm sewer, and sidewalks.

Public Input: Karl expressed her concern about the bill she received from Abstract Electric. Mignon explained it was given to the Village Attorney for her recommendation.

Visitors: None

A motion was made by Schreiber and seconded by Be Busse to approve the minutes of the August 8, 2019 meeting as presented. Motion carried 6-0

A motion was made by Siebert and seconded by Maertz to pay the accounts payable in the amount of \$206,226.17. Motion carried 6-0.

The monthly report was presented from Valders Ambulance Service. A motion was made by Schreiber and seconded by Siebert to appoint Mary Olson to another 5-year term as the Chairperson of the Reedsville Housing Authority Board. Motion carried 6-0. A motion was made by Be Busse and seconded by Rataichek to approve the Operator License Applications from Haley Schuman and Kelsey Stadler. Motion carried 4-0 (Schreiber abstained). A motion was made by Schreiber and seconded by Maertz to obtain additional quotes on reassessing property within the Village. Motion carried 6-0. A motion was made by Siebert and seconded by Rataichek to approve the request to combine parcels from Antonio and Michelle Butturini. Motion carried 6-0.

The Police Dept. monthly written report was presented by Mignon.

The Fire Dept. monthly written report was presented by Busse.

The Utility Dept. monthly written report was presented by Meyer.

The Public Works Dept. monthly written report was presented by J Schuh. Schuh was informed that the score board is to be returned due to damage. A motion was made by Be Busse and seconded by Maertz to approve the quote from Absolute Electric LLC to provide wiring of the lights on Park Street in the amount of \$5,000. Motion carried 6-0. Rataichek will contact the individual to explain why the wreathes will no longer be put up on Park Street. An individual will be contacted giving him 15 days to remove a tree.

The First Responders monthly written report was presented by Foytik. She informed the Board that effective October 1, 2019, the Fire Dept personal will not automatically respond to First Responders calls and that they are looking into purchasing a different First Responders vehicle.

A motion was made by Be Busse and seconded by Schreiber to hold Truck or Treating on Sunday, October 27, 2019 from 2:00 pm to 4:00 pm. Motion carried 6-0. A special meeting was scheduled for September 25, 2019 at 5:30 pm to work on the 2020 budget.

Schreiber gave an update on the ambulance meeting held in Valders. A discussion was held regarding maintenance of the Parks.

At 8:52 pm a motion was made by Siebert and seconded by Schreiber to convene into closed session pursuant to Section 19:85(1)(c) to conduct business which requires a closed session to consider performance of a public employee over which the governmental body has jurisdiction or exercises responsibility. Motion carried 6-0. At 9:05 pm a motion was made by Schreiber and seconded by Maertz to reconvene into open session. Motion carried 6-0.

The next regular monthly meeting will be held on Thursday, October 10, 2019 at 6:30 PM. A motion was made by Maertz and seconded by Siebert to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried 6-0. Meeting adjourned at 9:10 PM.
