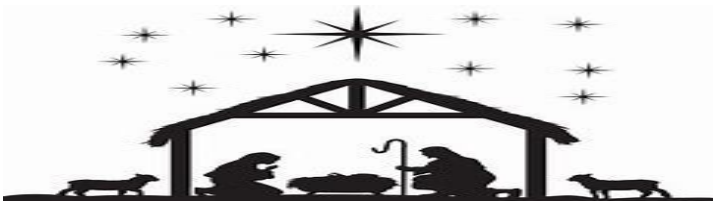

Nomination Papers: Fill-in forms for Village Trustee can be found on the Reedsville Website under Links, on the Wisconsin Elections Commission Website under Forms or blank forms are available in the lobby in the Reedsville Municipal Building. All completed forms must be returned to the Village Clerk/Treasurer's office by 4:30 PM on or before January 7, 2020 in order for the candidate's name to be placed on the ballot. All elected officials serve a two-year term beginning the third Tuesday of April.

Payment of Property Taxes:

- Real estate and personal property tax payments can be made in person at the Reedsville Municipal Building during normal business hours.
- Payments may also be made by sending a check to the following: Reedsville Municipal Building, Tax Collection, 217 Menasha St., Reedsville, WI 54230-8597. Taxes paid by check or money order must be made payable to the Village of Reedsville. **Cash will not be accepted.** A receipt will only be sent back if you have included a self-addressed stamped envelope. You can pay your taxes on-line at <https://client.pointandpay.net/web/VillageofReedsvilleWIWeb>. This address can also be found on the Reedsville Website under Links. All first installment taxes are due by January 31st.

Solid Waste & Recycling Carts need to be out on the curb by 5:00 am for service. DO NOT place carts within 4' ft of any objects such as utility poles, mailboxes, or vehicle. Carts need to be on separate sides of your driveway or at least 4' apart. Carts placed on the street or on snow banks will be not be serviced.

Cat & Dog Licenses: Unspayed females and unneutered males are \$10.00 each. Spayed females and neutered males are \$5.00 each. You must show proof of a valid rabies shot. Please make out a separate check for the licenses as it goes into a different account.

Clerk/Treasurer's Office Hours: Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday, 8:30 pm – 4:30 pm. Closed Wednesday.

The Reedsville Municipal Building will be closed all day December 23rd thru 27th & January 1st and at noon on December 31st for the holidays.

SUNRISE HORSE FARM

A few years ago Angie and I attended a conference in Madison with Dr. Lew Sterrett who is an excellent horse trainer. With Christmas coming I would like to share some of his thoughts: When horses think of freedom, they probably imagine green pastures and open ranges. They don't think of reins, saddles, or bits. We as humans think freedom and success come with piles of money, unlimited pleasures, and the freedom to do whatever we want. In reality, this is why horses (and humans!) require training. Boundaries are often used to teach us direction. When we cross healthy boundaries (such as traffic rules, criminal laws, or ethical standards), we end up with a lawless, self-centered society that produces tragic consequences. God uses boundaries in our lives, like His Word, His character, and circumstances to teach us how to live obediently to His purpose for our lives. Our Heavenly Father is the One who took the initiative to offer us grace to restore our lives and relationship with Him. In ancient times, He sent godly messengers and prophets to teach about His character and love. Then He sent His Son, Jesus Christ, to die on the cross in order to take away our sins. "But God demonstrated His love towards us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us," (Romans 5:8). As a trainer, I work to win the confidence and trust of the horses that I train. Instead of forcing them into obedience, I want them to want a relationship with me. When a horse has a good relationship with me as a trainer, we can do great things together. In the same way, when we have a relationship with our Master Trainer, we will live our lives in a way that honors Him. We have to daily make the choice to let God take the reins and give us peace and guidance. When we honor the boundaries of the Bible, we will find security and confidence in our Master Trainer.

Thank you Lew Sterrett for your wisdom in training horses and your use of God's wisdom in reaching people with His message. As we celebrate Christmas we remember to honor the Lord in all we do.

The monthly meeting of the Reedsville Village Board was called to order on October 10, 2019, at 6:30 PM by Village President Jesse Walt. A motion was made by Schreiber and seconded by Siebert to approve the agenda as presented. Motion carried 6-0.

Public Input: Glasow had questions regarding possible business locations.

A motion was made by Rataichek and seconded by Siebert to approve the minutes of the September 12, 2019 meeting. Motion carried 6-0

A motion was made by Schreiber and seconded by Siebert to pay the accounts payable in the amount of \$85,284.62. Motion carried 6-0.

The September monthly report was presented from Valders Ambulance Service. The Discussion/Possible Decision on the Valders Ambulance Service/Rescue Contract was postponed until Walt attends the next Reedsville First Responders meeting

The Police Dept. monthly written report was presented by Mignon.

The Fire Dept. monthly written report was presented by Br Busse. A motion was made by Siebert and seconded by Rataichek to approve the application from Dennis Volkmann. Final approval will be given upon completion of schooling. Motion carried 6-0. A motion was made by Schreiber and seconded by Hansen to reinstate Aaron Barr. Motion carried 6-0. Following a discussion it was decided to update the tax forms for the Firemen every 5 years and that the Village Clerk is to give the forms to the Fire Chief in April.

The Utility Dept. monthly written report was presented by Duenkel. A motion was made by Schreiber and Siebert to disposal of the leaded water service parts and to order the replacements as needed. Motion carried. The discussion on the hydrants was postponed until the next regular scheduled Village Board meeting. A motion was made by Hansen and seconded by Siebert to include the maintenance of the Well #3 motor into the Emergency Operations Plan. Motion carried.

The Public Works Dept. monthly written report was presented by J Schuh. The boundaries on chipping will be discussed at the next regular scheduled Village Board meeting.

The First Responders monthly written report was presented.

Following the Public Hearing, a motion was made by Rataichek and seconded by Siebert to approve the

rezoning of the property located at 536 Deerview Drive to residential. Motion carried 6-0. The discussion on the delinquent personal property tax bill was postponed until December 2019. A motion was made Schreiber and seconded by Siebert to prepare the Land Request for Proposal for the Village owned land for 5 years. Krahn gave an update on health insurance. A special meeting will be scheduled for October 24, 2019 at 5:30 pm to work on the 2020 budget.

At 9:00 pm a motion was made by Siebert and seconded by Schreiber to convene into closed session pursuant to Section 19:85(1)(c) to to conduct business which requires a closed session to consider performances of public employees over which the governmental body has jurisdiction or exercises responsibility. Motion carried 6-0. At 10:00 pm a motion was made by Schreiber and seconded by Be Busse to reconvene into open session. Motion carried 6-0.

The next regular monthly meeting will be held on Thursday, November 14, 2019 at 6:30 PM. A motion was made by Siebert and seconded by Be Busse to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried 6-0. Meeting adjourned at 10:03 PM.
